22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 17 is amended to add an additional
25	chapter to read as follows:
26	<u>CHAPTER 108</u>
27	NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN PRACTICE ACT

29	<u>Subchapter 1 — General Provisions</u>

31	<u>17-108-101. Title.</u>
32	This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Naturopathic
33	Physician Practice Act".

35	17-108-102. Legislative findings and intent.
36	(a) The General Assembly finds that:



1	(1) The practice of naturopathic medicine in this state affects
2	the public health, safety, and welfare and should be subject to regulation
3	and control in the public interest; and
4	(2) Naturopathic physicians comprise a distinct healthcare
5	profession that affects the public health, safety, and welfare and increases
6	freedom of choice in health care in this state.
7	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to ensure that
8	naturopathic physicians and the practice of naturopathic medicine as defined
9	in this subchapter merit the confidence of the public, that only qualified
10	persons be authorized to practice naturopathic medicine in this state, and
11	that a person shall not practice naturopathic medicine without a valid
12	existing license.
13	
14	<u>17-108-103. Definitions.</u>
15	As used in this subchapter:
16	(1) "Approved naturopathic medical school" means a medical
17	school approved by the Arkansas State Board of Natural Medicine under this
18	subchapter that prepares a naturopathic physician for the practice of
19	naturopathic medicine;
20	(2) "Clinical laboratory procedure" means the use of
21	venipuncture consistent with naturopathic medical practice, commonly used

34	personal hygiene, asepsis, public health, and safety;

DO NOT CODIFY. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. Transition period -12 Membership. (a)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (a)(2) of this section, the 13 existing members of the Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related 14 15 Techniques shall have their terms expire upon the effective date of this act. 16 (2) The two (2) memb<u>ers of the Arkansas State Board of</u> 17 Acupuncture and Related Techniques who represent the public shall continue to 18 serve as members of the Arkansas State Board of Natural Medicine and shall 19 exercise the powers and duties assigned until the expiration of the members' 20 terms. 21 (3) Members of the Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and 22 Related Techniques may be appointed to serve as members of the Arkansas State 23 Board of Natural Medicine. (b) Except as provided in subdivision (a)(2) of this section, upon the 24 effective date of this act, the initial members of the Arkansas State Board 25 26 of Natural Medicine created under this act shall be appointed by the Governor 27 for staggered terms as follows: 28 (1) The term of one (1) member who is an acupuncturist and one 29 (1) member who is a naturopathic physician shall expire after one (1) year; 30 (2) The term of one (1) member who is an acupuncturist and one (1) member who is a naturopathic physician shall expire after two (2) years; 31 32 and 33 (3) The term of one (1) member who is an acupuncturist and one 34 (1) member who is a naturopathic physician shall expire after three (3) 35 years. 36

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
