SENATE BILL 240

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PROVISION OF
9 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO ARKANSAS CITIZENS ENGAGED IN THE
10 STUDY OF DENTAL MEDICINE, OPTOMETRY, *OSTEOPATHY*,
11 VETERINARY MEDICINE, CHIROPRACTIC EDUCATION AND PODIATRY
12 EDUCATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS FOR THE BIENNIAL
13 PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1993; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

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15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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17 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the
18 University of Arkansas, to be payable from the Department of Higher Education
19 Grants Fund Account, for payments of the contracts with schools of higher
20 learning for the education of Arkansas citizens at out-of-state institutions
21 of higher learning in the fields of dental medicine, optometry, *osteopathy*,
22 veterinary medicine, chiropractic education and podiatry education by the
23 University of Arkansas for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the

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SECTION 2. TRANSFER OF HIGHER EDUCATION GRANTS FUND APPROPRIATIONS.

Upon certification to and with the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, surplus funds and appropriations may be transferred between the appropriations herein provided by the Seventy-Eighth General Assembly for SREB Dental Aid, Non-SREB Dental Aid, Optometry Aid, SREB Veterinary Aid, Non-SREB Veterinary Aid, Podiatry Aid and Chiropractic Aid.

SECTION 3. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. The Disbursing Officer of the

University of Arkansas/Fayetteville shall annually compile information, as described herein, on students who receive financial aid through the various appropriations provided for in this Act. Such information shall include the number of students receiving financial aid under each line item of Section 1 of this Act, the name of each out-of-state school which each student is attending or has attended, and the location and occupation of each student after they have completed their course of study for a period of three years.

Such information shall be compiled into a report and presented in conjunction with the biennial appropriation budget request for the appropriation provided herein, to the Arkansas Legislative Council.

SECTION 4. CARRY FORWARD. *The balance of the funds and appropriations*

as provided in this Act which remain on June 30, 1992, shall be carried forward and made available for the same purposes for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1993.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATIONS - ACADEMIC CHALLENGE SCHOLARSHIPS.

There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Higher Education, to be payable from the Department of Higher Education Grants Fund Account, for scholarship grants and maintenance and operation of the Department of Higher Education - Academic Challenge Scholarships for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the following:

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11 SECTION 6. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
12 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
13 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
14 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
15 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
16 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control
17 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the
18 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
19 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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21 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
22 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
23 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which
24 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
25 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
26 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
27 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
28 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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30 SECTION 8. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent
31 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
32 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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34 SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
35 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such

1 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
2 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
3 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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5 SECTION 10. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
6 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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8 SECTION 11. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
9 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of
10 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year
11 period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1991 is essential to the
12 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided,
13 and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the
14 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm
15 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
16 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
17 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
18 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.
