25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

27 SECTION 1. The third Friday in September shall be known as "POW/MIA
28 Recognition Day" to honor American prisoners of war and those missing in
29 action, all of whom have made extraordinary sacrifices on behalf of the United
30 States of America. POW/MIA Recognition Day shall not be a legal holiday but
31 shall be memorial day to be commemorated by the issuance of appropriate
32 proclamation by the Governor.

34 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
35 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
36 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
