11 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE ARKANSAS ORTHOTICS,  
12 PROSTHETICS, AND PEDORTHICS PRACTICE ACT OF 2007;  
13 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

14  
15 **Subtitle**

16 ARKANSAS ORTHOTICS, PROSTHETICS, AND  
17 PEDORTHICS PRACTICE ACT OF 2007.

18  
19  
20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

21  
22 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 17 is amended to add the following new  
23 chapter:

24 Chapter 107. Orthotists, Prosthetists, and Pedorthists.

25 Subchapter 1. General Provisions.

26 17-107-101. Title.

27 This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Arkansas  
28 Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Practice Act of 2007".

29  
30 17-107-102. Purpose.

31 Since the professions related to orthotics, prosthetics, and pedorthics  
32 significantly affect the lives of the people of this state, it is the purpose  
33 of this chapter to protect resources available to the Arkansas Medicaid  
34 Program and the public in general by setting standards of qualification,  
35 training, and experience for those who represent themselves to the public as



1 orthotists, prosthetists, and pedorthists and by promoting high standards of  
2 professional performance for those engaged in the practice of orthotics,  
3 prosthetics, and pedorthics.

4  
5 17-107-103. Definitions.

6 As used in this chapter:

7 (1)(A) "Orthosis" means an external device that is:

8 (i) Intended to restore physiological function or  
9 cosmesis to a patient; and

10 (ii) Custom-designed, fabricated, assembled, fitted,  
11 or adjusted for the patient using the device prior to or concurrent with the  
12 delivery of the device to the patient.

13 (B) "Orthosis" does not include a cane, crutch, corset,  
14 dental appliance, elastic hose, elastic support, fabric support, generic arch  
15 support, low-temperature plastic splint, soft cervical collar, truss, or  
16 other similar device that:

17 (i) Is carried in stock and sold without therapeutic  
18 modification by a corset shop, department store, drug store, surgical supply  
19 facility, or similar retail entity; and

20 (ii) Has no significant impact on the neuromuscular,  
21 musculoskeletal, or neuromusculoskeletal functions of the body;

22 (2) "Orthotic assistant" means an individual who is licensed  
23 under this chapter to assist an orthotist or an orthotist/prosthetist with  
24 patient care services and fabrication of orthoses under the supervision of an  
25 orthotist or an orthotist/prosthetist;

26 (3) "Orthotic education program" means a course of instruction  
27 in orthotics:

28 (A) Accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of  
29 Allied Health Education Programs; and

30 (B) Approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and  
31 Pedorthics Advisory Board;

32 (4) "Orthotic resident" means an individual who has completed an  
33 orthotic education program and is continuing his or her clinical education in  
34 an orthotic residency program:

35 (A) Accredited by the National Commission on Orthotic and  
36 Prosthetic Education; and

1                   (B) Approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and  
2 Pedorthics Advisory Board;

3                   (5) "Orthotics" means the science and practice of providing or  
4 managing the provision of an orthosis based on clinical assessment, technical  
5 judgment, and an order from a health care practitioner authorized by law to  
6 write an order for an orthosis;

7                   (6) "Orthotist" means an individual who is licensed under this  
8 chapter to practice orthotics and pedorthics;

9                   (7) "Orthotic/prosthetic assistant" means an individual who is  
10 licensed under this chapter to assist both an orthotist and a prosthetist  
11 with patient care services and fabrication of prostheses, orthoses, or  
12 pedorthic devices under the supervision of an orthotist, an  
13 orthotist/prosthetist, or a prosthetist as appropriate; and

14                   (8) "Orthotist/prosthetist" means an individual who is licensed  
15 to practice orthotics, pedorthics, and prosthetics;

16                   (9)(A) "Pedorthic device" means therapeutic footwear, foot  
17 orthoses for use at the ankle or below, or footwear modified for therapeutic  
18 purposes as ordered by a licensed health care practitioner authorized by law  
19 to write an order for a pedorthic device.

20                   (B) "Pedorthic device" does not include:

21                   (i) Nontherapeutic accommodative inlays or  
22 nontherapeutic accommodative footwear regardless of method of manufacture;

23                   (ii) Shoes modified or made for nontherapeutic  
24 purposes;

25                   (iii) Unmodified shoes; or

26                   (iv) Prefabricated foot care products;

27                   (10) "Pedorthic education program" means a course of instruction  
28 in pedorthics:

29                   (A) Accredited by the American Board for Certification in  
30 Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics, Inc.; and

31                   (B) Approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and  
32 Pedorthics Advisory Board;

33                   (11) "Pedorthics" means the science and practice of providing or  
34 managing the provision of a pedorthic device based on clinical assessment,  
35 technical judgment, and an order from a health care practitioner authorized  
36 by law to write an order for a pedorthic device;

1           (12) "Pedorthist" means an individual who is licensed under this  
2 chapter to practice pedorthics;

3           (13)(A) "Prefabricated device" means a mass-produced device  
4 that:

5                   (i) Is prepackaged, carried in stock, and sold off  
6 the shelf or over the counter by a corset shop, department store, drug store,  
7 surgical supply facility, or similar retail entity; and

8                   (ii) Does not require clinical assessment, technical  
9 judgment, or therapeutic modification for appropriate use by the customer.

10           (B) "Prefabricated device" may include a cane, a crutch, a  
11 corset, an elastic hose, an elastic support, a fabric support, a generic arch  
12 support, a low-temperature plastic splint, a soft cervical collar, a truss,  
13 or other similar device;

14           (14)(A) "Prosthesis" means an external device that is:

15                   (i) Intended to replace an absent external body part  
16 for the purpose of restoring physiological function or cosmesis to a patient;  
17 and

18                   (ii) Custom-designed, fabricated, assembled, fitted,  
19 or adjusted for the patient using the device prior to or concurrent with  
20 being delivered to the patient;

21           (B) "Prosthesis" does not include an artificial eye, an  
22 artificial ear, a dental appliance, a cosmetic device, such as artificial  
23 eyelashes or wigs, an artificial facial device, or other device that does not  
24 have a significant impact on the neuromuscular, musculoskeletal, or  
25 neuromusculoskeletal functions of the body;

26           (15) "Prosthetic assistant" means an individual who is licensed  
27 under this chapter to assist a prosthetist or orthotist/prosthetist with  
28 patient care services and fabrication of prostheses under the supervision of  
29 a prosthetist or an orthotist/prosthetist; and

30           (16) "Prosthetic education program" means a course of  
31 instruction in prosthetics;

32                   (A) Accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of  
33 Allied Health Education Programs; and

34                   (B) Approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and  
35 Pedorthics Advisory Board;

36           (17) "Prosthetic resident" means an individual who has completed

1 a prosthetic education program and is continuing his or her clinical  
2 education in a prosthetic residency program;

3 (A) Accredited by the National Commission on Orthotic and  
4 Prosthetic Education; and

5 (B) Approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and  
6 Pedorthics Advisory Board;

7 (18) "Prosthetics" means the science and practice of providing  
8 or managing the provision of a prosthesis based on clinical assessment,  
9 technical judgment, and an order from a health care practitioner authorized  
10 to write an order for a prosthesis; and

11 (19) "Prosthetist" means an individual who is licensed under  
12 this chapter to practice prosthetics.

13  
14 17-107-104. Exemptions.

15 Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to restrict:

16 (1) The practice of orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics by:

17 (A) An individual who is employed by the federal government  
18 or any bureau, division, or agency of the federal government while in the  
19 discharge of the employee's official duties;

20 (B) A student enrolled in an orthotic education program,  
21 prosthetic education program, or pedorthic education program;

22 (C) An orthotic resident or prosthetic resident; or

23 (D) A student participating in a pedorthic work experience  
24 program or internship approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and  
25 Pedorthics Advisory Board;

26 (2) A licensed health care practitioner from engaging in the  
27 full scope of practice of the practitioner's profession or from doing work  
28 within the standards and ethics of his or her respective professions;

29 (3) An individual from sizing a prefabricated device, including  
30 without limitation, diabetic shoes and similar devices, for a customer if the  
31 individual:

32 (A) Is acting under the supervision and control of a  
33 pharmacist or pharmacy licensed under § 17-92-101 et seq.;

34 (B) Does not cast, measure, mold, or scan a part of the  
35 human body for the purpose of constructing an external device intended to  
36 treat a customer's medical condition; and

1                    (C) Can provide satisfactory evidence of one (1) of the  
2 following:

3                    (i) The individual has documentation of training  
4 from an orthotist, a prosthetist, a pedorthist, or a manufacturer approved by  
5 the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board;

6                    (ii) The individual is certified or registered as an  
7 orthotic fitter or a pedorthic fitter by a nationally recognized board or  
8 association approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics  
9 Advisory Board; or

10                   (iii) The individual works under the direct  
11 supervision of an orthotic fitter or pedorthic fitter who is certified or  
12 registered by a nationally recognized board or association approved by the  
13 Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board; and

14                   (4)(A) Any other licensed health care professional within this  
15 state, or prevent a member of any health care profession or any person  
16 employed by or supervised by a licensed health care professional from doing  
17 work of a nature consistent with the person's training, as long as the  
18 licensed health care professional does not hold himself or herself out to the  
19 public as a licensee under this chapter.

20                   (B) The exemption created in subdivision (4)(A) of this  
21 section expressly exempts licensure manufacturers' representatives so long as  
22 the process of measuring and fitting of the orthotic, prosthetic, or  
23 pedorthic device takes place under the supervision of a qualified member of a  
24 licensed health care profession within this state.

25                   (5) A licensed athletic trainer from engaging in the full scope  
26 of practice of the athletic trainer's profession or from doing work within  
27 the standards and ethics of the Arkansas State Board of Athletic Training.

28  
29                   17-107-105. Criminal penalty.

30                   (a)(1) It is a Class C misdemeanor for any individual to:

31                   (A) Practice orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics in this  
32 state unless he or she is licensed under this chapter;

33                   (B) Hold himself or herself out as being able to practice  
34 orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics in this state;

35                   (C) Dispense an orthosis, a prosthesis, or a pedorthic  
36 device unless he or she is licensed under this chapter;

1                   (D) Represent himself or herself to the public by title or  
2 description of services that includes any of the following terms unless he or  
3 she is licensed under this chapter:

4                   (i) "Orthotic", "orthotist", "brace", or a similar  
5 title or description of services;

6                   (ii) "Pedorthic", "pedorthist", or a similar title  
7 or description of services; or

8                   (iii) "Prosthetic", "prosthetist", "artificial  
9 limb", or a similar title or description of services;

10                   (E) Practice orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics during  
11 the time his or her license is suspended; or

12                   (F) Otherwise violate any provisions of this chapter or  
13 rules promulgated under this chapter.

14                   (2) Each day an offense under this section continues is a  
15 separate offense.

16                   (b) The Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board  
17 and the Department of Health and Human Services shall assist the prosecuting  
18 attorney in the enforcement of this chapter.

19  
20                   17-107-106. Civil penalty and injunction.

21                   (a)(1) The Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory  
22 Board may levy a civil penalty not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000)  
23 for each violation of this chapter or rules promulgated under this chapter  
24 against any individual found by the board to be in violation of this chapter  
25 or rules promulgated under this chapter.

26                   (2) Each day a violation continues is a separate offense.

27                   (3) Unless the civil penalty imposed under this section is paid  
28 within fifteen (15) calendar days following the date for an appeal from the  
29 order, the board may file suit in the Pulaski County Circuit Court to obtain  
30 a judgment for the amount of the unpaid civil penalty.

31                   (4)(A) The imposition of a civil penalty under this section does  
32 not relieve an individual from criminal prosecution under this chapter or  
33 from the imposition of an injunction under this section.

34                   (B) The remedy of a civil penalty under this section is  
35 additional to any other penalties that may be imposed by the board or by a  
36 circuit court under this chapter.

1       (b)(1) The board may petition any circuit court having jurisdiction  
2 over an individual who is practicing without a license as required by this  
3 chapter, an individual to whom a license has been denied, or an individual  
4 whose license has been suspended or revoked by action of the board under this  
5 chapter to enjoin the individual from continuing to practice within this  
6 state.

7       (2)(A) The issuance of an injunction under this section shall  
8 not relieve an individual from criminal prosecution under this chapter or the  
9 imposition of civil penalties under this section.

10       (B) The remedy of an injunction under this section is  
11 additional to any other penalties that may be imposed by the board or by a  
12 circuit court under this chapter.

13  
14 Subchapter 2. Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory  
15 Board.

16       17-107-201. Board -- Creation.

17       (a) There is created the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and  
18 Pedorthics Advisory Board consisting of seven (7) members as follows:

19       (1)(A) Five (5) individuals, each of whom is eligible for  
20 licensure as an orthotist, prosthetist, or pedorthist.

21       (B) One (1) of the five (5) individuals appointed under  
22 subdivision (a)(1)(A) of this section may be a retired orthotist,  
23 prosthetist, or pedorthist;

24       (2) One (1) member who is a representative of the Division of  
25 Medical Services of the Department of Health and Human Services; and

26       (3) One (1) member who is a representative of the public at  
27 large.

28       (b) The Governor shall appoint the members subject to confirmation by  
29 the Senate.

30       (c)(1) Each initial member who is eligible for licensure as an  
31 orthotist, a prosthetist, or a pedorthist shall be selected from a list of  
32 fifteen (15) candidates who have practiced orthotics, prosthetics, or  
33 pedorthics for at least three (3) years. The Arkansas Orthotic Prosthetic  
34 Association shall submit the list of candidates to the Governor no later than  
35 July 1, 2007.

36       (2)(A) Each successor member shall be selected from a list of



1 three (3) individuals per position submitted to the Governor by the board.

2 (B) Each successor member shall have practiced orthotics,  
3 prosthetics, or pedorthics for at least three (3) years preceding his or her  
4 appointment and shall be licensed under this chapter as an orthotist, a  
5 prosthetist, or a pedorthist.

6 (d)(1) The Governor shall designate the terms of the initial  
7 appointees so that three (3) members shall serve three-year terms, two (2)  
8 members shall serve two-year terms, and two (2) members shall serve one-year  
9 terms.

10 (2)(A)(i) Except as provided in subdivision (d)(2)(A)(ii) of  
11 this section, each successor member shall serve three-year terms.

12 (ii) An individual appointed to fill a vacancy  
13 resulting in an unexpired term shall only serve for the remainder of the  
14 unexpired term.

15 (B) The Governor shall fill any vacancy on the board in  
16 the same manner as other appointments.

17 (3)(A) Except as provided in subdivision (d)(3)(B) of this  
18 section, no member shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms.

19 (B) The member who is a representative of the Division of  
20 Medical Services of the Department of Health and Human Services may succeed  
21 himself or herself.

22 (e) Upon recommendation of the board made after notice and hearing,  
23 the Governor may remove any member for incompetence, neglect of duty, or  
24 malfeasance in office.

25  
26 17-107-202. Organization and proceedings.

27 (a)(1) Within thirty (30) days after the initial appointment of the  
28 members of the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory  
29 Board, the Governor shall call the first meeting of the board for the purpose  
30 of organization.

31 (2) The board shall elect a chair and vice chair at its first  
32 regularly scheduled meeting of each calendar year.

33 (3) The board shall meet as frequently as it deems necessary, at  
34 such times and places as the board designates. Additional meetings may be  
35 held upon call of the chair or upon written request of four (4) members.

36 (b) A quorum of the board shall consist of four (4) members.

1       (c) The members of the board shall serve without compensation but may  
2 receive expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-16-901 et seq.  
3 However, the expenses shall in no case exceed funds available to the board .

4       (d) All proceedings of the board shall be conducted in accordance with  
5 the Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq.

6       (e) The Division of Medical Services of the Department of Health and  
7 Human Services shall provide staff support for the board.

8  
9       17-107-203. Power to issue subpoenas and subpoenas duces tecum.

10       (a) In connection with its investigations and hearings, the Arkansas  
11 Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board may:

12           (1) Issue a subpoena to require any individual who has  
13 information germane to an investigation or hearing conducted by the board to  
14 testify before the board; and

15           (2) Issue a subpoena duces tecum to require to be transmitted to  
16 the board any book, writing, document, or other paper or thing which is  
17 germane to an investigation or hearing conducted by the board.

18       (b)(1) Service of a subpoena or a subpoena duces tecum shall be as  
19 provided by law for the service of a subpoena or a subpoena duces tecum in a  
20 civil case in a circuit court of this state. The fees and mileage of an  
21 officer serving a subpoena or a subpoena duces tecum and a witness appearing  
22 in answer to a subpoena shall be the same as provided by law for a proceeding  
23 in a civil case in a circuit court of this state.

24           (2)(A) The board shall issue a subpoena or a subpoena duces  
25 tecum upon the request of any party to a hearing before the board.

26           (B) The fees and mileage of an officer serving a subpoena  
27 or a subpoena duces tecum and a witness appearing in answer to a subpoena  
28 shall be paid by the party at whose request the witness is subpoenaed.

29       (c)(1) If an individual has been served with a subpoena or a subpoena  
30 duces tecum as provided in this section and fails to comply with the subpoena  
31 or the subpoena duces tecum, the board may apply to the circuit court of the  
32 county in which the board is conducting its investigation or hearing for an  
33 order causing the arrest of the individual and directing that the individual  
34 be brought before the court.

35           (2) The circuit court may punish the disobedient individual for  
36 contempt as provided by law for a proceeding of a civil case in a circuit

1 court of this state.

2  
3 17-107-204. State Board of Health – Powers and duties.

4 (a) The State Board of Health shall adopt rules prescribing all of the  
5 following:

6 (1) Procedures for the issuance, renewal, inactivation,  
7 restoration, suspension, and revocation of a license or certification;

8 (2) Standards and procedures for formulating, evaluating,  
9 approving, and administering licensing examinations or recognizing other  
10 entities that conduct examinations;

11 (3) Procedures for the conduct of a disciplinary hearing;

12 (4) Standards of ethical and professional conduct in the  
13 practice of orthotics, prosthetics, and pedorthics;

14 (5) Standards for approving, denying, and withdrawing approval  
15 of national certification organizations in orthotics, prosthetics, and  
16 pedorthics;

17 (6) Standards for approving, denying, and withdrawing approval  
18 of educational programs required for licensure, including standards for  
19 foreign educational credentials;

20 (7) Standards for approving, denying, and withdrawing approval  
21 of continuing education programs required for license renewal;

22 (8) Standards for regulating advertising by individuals licensed  
23 under this chapter;

24 (9)(A) Fees and penalties for services relating to examination,  
25 licensing, endorsement, temporary permits, license renewal, and other  
26 services reasonably related to the practice of orthotics, prosthetics, or  
27 pedorthics as determined by the board.

28 (B) The fee for initial licensure and renewal of licensure  
29 for the practice of orthotics, pedorthics, or prosthetics shall be three  
30 hundred dollars (\$300) every two (2) years;

31 (C) The fee for initial certification and renewal of  
32 certification as an orthotic assistant, an orthotic/prosthetic assistant, or  
33 a prosthetic assistant shall be one hundred dollars (\$100) every two (2)  
34 years; and

35 (10) Civil money penalties for violations of this chapter.

36 (b) The board may adopt other rules that are reasonably related to the

1 safe and competent performance of prosthetics, orthotics, and pedorthics and  
2 necessary for the administration of this chapter.

3  
4 17-107-205. Deposit of funds.

5 All funds received by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and  
6 Pedorthics Advisory Board shall be deposited into the Health Facility  
7 Services Revolving Fund.

8  
9 Subchapter 3. Licensing.

10 17-107-301. Orthotists.

11 (a) An applicant for a license to practice orthotics shall submit to  
12 the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board written  
13 evidence verified by oath that the applicant:

14 (1) Possesses a baccalaureate degree or has completed semester  
15 hours equivalent to four (4) years of study at a four-year college or  
16 university;

17 (2) Has completed an orthotic education program;

18 (3) Has completed a clinical residency in orthotics;

19 (4) Is qualified to practice in accordance with commonly  
20 accepted standards of orthotic care; and

21 (5) Satisfies any other requirements established by the board  
22 that are reasonably related to the practice of orthotics.

23 (b) The board may issue a license to practice orthotics to an  
24 applicant:

25 (1) By examination, if the applicant passes an examination  
26 approved by the board; or

27 (2) By endorsement, if the applicant has been licensed as an  
28 orthotist under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign country and  
29 meets the qualifications required of orthotists in this state.

30  
31 17-107-302. Pedorthists.

32 (a) An applicant for a license to practice pedorthics shall submit to  
33 the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board written  
34 evidence verified by oath that the applicant:

35 (1) Possesses a high school diploma or comparable credential  
36 approved by the board;

1           (2) Has completed a pedorthic education program;

2           (3) Has completed a qualified work experience program or  
3 internship in pedorthics;

4           (4) Is qualified to practice in accordance with commonly  
5 accepted standards of pedorthic care acceptable to the board; and

6           (5) Satisfies any other requirements established by the board  
7 that are reasonably related to the practice of pedorthics.

8           (b) The board may issue a license to practice pedorthics:

9           (1) By examination, if the applicant passes an examination  
10 approved by the board; or

11           (2) By endorsement, if an applicant has been licensed as a  
12 pedorthist under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign country and  
13 meets the qualifications required of pedorthists in this state.

14  
15           17-107-303. Prosthetists.

16           (a) An applicant for a license to practice prosthetics shall submit to  
17 the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board written  
18 evidence verified by oath that the applicant:

19           (1) Possesses a baccalaureate degree or has completed semester  
20 hours equivalent to four (4) years of study at a four-year college or  
21 university;

22           (2) Has completed a prosthetic education program;

23           (3) Has completed a clinical residency in prosthetics;

24           (4) Is qualified to practice in accordance with commonly  
25 accepted standards of prosthetic care; and

26           (5) Satisfies any other requirements established by the board  
27 that are reasonably related to the practice of prosthetics.

28           (b) The board may issue a license to practice prosthetics to an  
29 applicant:

30           (1) By examination, if the applicant passes an examination  
31 approved by the board; or

32           (2) By endorsement, if the applicant has been licensed as a  
33 prosthetist under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign country  
34 and meets the qualifications required of prosthetists in this state.

1  
2 17-107-304. Orthotic assistants, prosthetic assistants,  
3 orthotic/prosthetic assistants.

4 An applicant for certification to practice as an orthotic assistant, an

8 (1) Possesses a high school diploma or comparable credential  
9 approved by the board;

10 (2) Has a minimum of five (5) years of experience in the field  
11 in which the individual is seeking licensure as an assistant; and

12 (3) Has written documentation from a licensed prosthetist or a  
13 licensed orthotist that the applicant is qualified to perform as an assistant  
14 in the field in which the individual is seeking licensure as an assistant.

16 17-107-305. Temporary permits.

17 (a)(1) The Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory  
18 Board may issue a temporary permit to practice orthotics, prosthetics, or  
19 pedorthics to a qualified applicant who has:

20 (A) Satisfactorily completed an approved education program  
21 in the field in which the individual is seeking licensure; and

22 (B) Applied for or is awaiting results of the first  
23 examination he or she is eligible to take after the permit is issued.

24 (2) The temporary permit to practice orthotics, prosthetics, or  
25 pedorthics becomes invalid upon notification to the applicant of the results  
26 of the first examination he or she is eligible to take after the permit is

28 (b)(1) The board may issue a temporary permit to practice orthotics,  
29 prosthetics, or pedorthics to a qualified applicant awaiting endorsement and

2 17-107-306. License -- Renewal.

3 (a) An individual licensed or certified under this chapter shall renew  
4 his or her license or certification with the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics,  
5 and Pedorthics Advisory Board in accordance with this section and procedures  
6 established by the board.

7 (b)(1) At least sixty (60) days prior to the renewal date of a  
8 individual's license or certification under this chapter, the board shall:

9 (A) Mail to the individual a renewal application for his  
10 or her license or certification; and

11 (B) Notify the individual of the renewal date of his or  
12 her license or certification.

13 (2) The board shall mail the renewal application to the most  
14 recent address of the individual as the address appears in the records of the  
15 board.

16 (3) The individual shall complete the renewal application and  
17 return it to the board with the required renewal fee by the renewal date of

4                   (B) A renewal application and the board determines that  
5 the renewal application is accurate; and

6           (2) The renewal fee plus a penalty is paid by a date specified  
7 by the board.

9           17-107-307. License -- Display.

10          (a) An individual licensed or certified under this chapter shall:

11                   (1) Keep his or her license prominently displayed in his or her  
12 office or in a place in which he or she practices; or

13                   (2) Store his or her license in a place from which the license  
14 can be immediately produced upon request of a patient or a representative of  
15 the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board.

16  
17          17-107-308. License -- Replacement.

18          (a) An individual licensed or certified under this chapter whose  
19 license has been lost or destroyed may apply to the Arkansas Orthotics,  
20 Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board for a replacement. The  
21 application shall be accompanied by an affidavit setting out the facts  
22 concerning the loss or destruction of the original license.

23          (b) An individual licensed or certified under this chapter whose name  
24 is changed by marriage or court order may surrender his or her license and  
25 apply to the board for a replacement license.

27          17-107-309. License -- Inactive status.

28          (a) An individual licensed or certified under this chapter may place  
29 his or her license or certification on inactive status by notifying the  
30 Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board in writing.

31                   (b)(1) The holder of an inactive license or certification is excused  
32 from payment of renewal fees and shall not practice in his or her area of  
33 licensure or certification in this state.

34                   (2) Any individual who engages in the practice of orthotics,  
35 pedorthics, or prosthetics or serves as an orthotic assistant,  
36 orthotic/prosthetic assistant, or prosthetic assistant while his or her



1 license or certification under this chapter is inactive is considered to be  
2 practicing without a license or certification. Practicing without a license  
3 or certification is grounds for discipline under § 17-107-310.

4 (c) The board may restore an inactive license or certification under  
5 this chapter if:

6 (1) The holder of the inactive license or certification:

7 (A) Successfully completes the continuing education  
8 requirements established by the board; and

9 (B) Complies with rules established by the board; and

10 (2) The current renewal fee is paid by a date specified by the  
11 board.

12  
13 17-107-310. Disciplinary action.

14 The Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Advisory Board may  
15 deny, suspend, revoke, or restrict any license or certification issued under  
16 this chapter or otherwise discipline an individual licensed or certified  
17 under this chapter upon proof that the individual:

18 (1) Has plead guilty or nolo contendere to or has been found  
19 guilty of a felony;

20 (2) Has used intoxicating liquors, narcotics, controlled  
21 substances, or other drugs in a manner that adversely affects the license or  
22 certificate holder's ability to practice;

23 (3) Has become physically or mentally incompetent to practice to  
24 the extent that the license or certificate holder's professional competence  
25 is impaired and the public is endangered;

26 (4) Has committed fraud or deceit in the procuring or attempting  
27 to procure a license or certification under this chapter;

28 (5) Has aided or abetted an unlicensed or uncertified individual

9 17-107-311. Grandfather provisions.

10 (a)(1) Until December 31, 2007, the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics,  
11 and Pedorthics Advisory Board may issue a license to practice orthotics under  
12 this chapter to:

13 (A) An individual who makes application for licensure as  
14 an orthotist, pays the required licensure fee, and submits evidence of  
15 certification from one (1) of the following:

16 (i) The American Board for Certification in  
17 Orthotics and Prosthetics, Inc., as a Certified Orthotist or Certified  
18 Orthotist/Prosthetist;

19 (ii) The Board for Orthotist/Prosthetist

 11 requirements of § 17-107-301;

12 (2) An applicant for licensure as a pedorthist who satisfies the  
 13 requirements of § 17-107-302; and

14 (3) An applicant for licensure as a prosthetist who satisfies  
 15 the requirements of § 17-107-303.

 17 *SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 19-5-1089 is amended to read as follows:*

18 *19-5-1089. Health Facility Services Revolving Fund.*

19 *There is to be established on the books of the Treasurer of State,*  
 20 *Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a special revenue*  
 21 *fund to be known as the Health Facility Services Revolving Fund. The Health*
