22 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE ARKANSAS
23 INFORMATION READING SERVICES FOR THE
24 BLIND WITHIN THE DIVISION OF STATE
25 SERVICES FOR THE BLIND OF THE DEPARTMENT
26 OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.
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30 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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32 SECTION 1. Public policy – Findings.

33 (a) It is the public policy of the State of Arkansas to:

34 (1) Provide visually handicapped persons with services that are
35 reasonably necessary to allow visually handicapped persons the opportunity to



1 lead full, useful, and productive lives; and

2 (2) Expend funds intended to improve the lives of visually
 3 handicapped persons in the most efficient and effective manner possible.

4 (b) The General Assembly finds that the purposes set forth in
 5 subsection (a) of this section may be advanced by the establishment in law of
 6 an Information Reading Services for the Blind within the Division of State
 7 Services for the Blind of the Department of Health and Human Services to
 8 provide audible access to statewide public notices, newspaper articles of
 9 interest and other information, particularly at the local level, to persons
 10 who are visually handicapped.

 12 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 25, Chapter 10, Subchapter 2 is amended
 13 to add an additional section to read as follows:

14 25-10-209. Information Reading Services for the Blind created.

15 (a) The Information Reading Services for the Blind is created within
 16 the Division of State Services for the Blind of the Department of Health and
 17 Human Services.

18 (b) The Information Reading Services for the Blind shall be:

19 (1) An integral part of the rehabilitation state plan of the
 20 Division of State Services for the Blind;

21 (2) A network to:

22 (A) Provide audible access to statewide public notices,
 23 newspaper articles of interest and other information, particularly at the
 24 local level, to persons who are visually handicapped; and

25 (B) Translate existing local, state, and national
 26 information into an audible format to make it available for access by
 27 visually handicapped persons; and

28 (3) Available to all state agencies as a means of making public
 29 notices audibly accessible to visually handicapped persons who cannot read
 30 print.

31 (c) This section does not limit the eligibility of the Information
 32 Reading Services for the Blind to receive line-item state or federal grant
 33 funding targeted solely for support of its programming.

34 (d) The Director of the Division of State Services for the Blind of
 35 the Department of Health and Human Services shall consult at least annually
 36 with active consumers of the Information Reading Services for the Blind,

1 including participating state agencies, in the design, improvement, and
2 delivery of the services.
