19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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21 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - REAPPORTIONMENT. There is hereby
22 established for the Office of the Governor for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the
23 following maximum number of regular employees.

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32 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - REAPPORTIONMENT. There is hereby authorized,
33 for the Office of the Governor for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the following
34 maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra
35 Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: one (1)
36 temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed



1 those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its
2 successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

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4 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - REAPPORTIONMENT. There is hereby
5 appropriated, to the Office of the Governor, to be payable from the State
6 Central Services Fund, for personal services and operating expenses
7 associated with reapportionment of the Office of the Governor for the fiscal
8 year ending June 30, 2021, the following:

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23 SECTION 4. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
24 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
25 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
26 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
27 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
28 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
29 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
30 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
31 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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33 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
34 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
35 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
36 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive

1 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
 2 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
 3 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
 4 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
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6 SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
 7 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of
 8 the Office of the Governor are, due to unforeseen circumstances, insufficient
 9 for the Office of the Governor to continue to provide essential governmental
 10 services; that the provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies
 11 for the Office of the Governor to continue such services; and that a delay in
 12 the effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper
 13 administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,
 14 an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the
 15 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in
 16 full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

17 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall
 18 become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the
 19 Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the
 20 veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house
 21 overrides the veto.
