## Legislative Impact Statement

**Bill: SB14**

**Amendment Number: H1**

**Bill Subtitle: CONCERNING THE FEE TO ATTEND A VICTIM IMPACT PANEL THAT IS REQUIRED BY LAW OF ANY PERSON CONVICTED OF DRIVING OR BOATING WHILE INTOXICATED, REFUSAL TO SUBMIT TO A CHEMICAL TEST, OR POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL BY A MINOR.**

### **Basic Change :**

**Sponsors: Sen. Chesterfield and Rep. Love**

Currently, a person or underage person whose driving privileges are suspended or revoked for Driving or Boating While Intoxicated, Refusal to Submit to a Chemical Test or Possession of Alcohol While Underage must attend a victim impact panel sponsored by an organization approved by the Division of Aging, Adult and Behavioral Health Services of the Department of Human Services. The current cost to attend this program is \$10.00. This cost for an enrollee who resides in the Department of Community Corrections would remain \$10.00 but increase for all others to \$20.00.

### **Revenue Impact :**

### **Taxpayer Impact :**

A person who has suspended or revoked driving privileges may be required to pay \$20.00 to attend the victim impact panel and others who reside in the Department of Community Correction will continue to pay \$10.00 to complete the requirement prior to driving privileges being reinstated.

### **Legal Analysis :**

Amendment H1 clarifies that enrollees who reside in a facility operated by the Department of Community Correction may only be charged \$10.00. The amendment further clarifies that the fees collected shall be remitted to an organization that is approved by the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services of the Department of Human Services.
