Basic Change:

HB1284 removes a court's ability to suspend or revoke a person's motor vehicle registration or driving privileges for failing to make satisfactory payment arrangements for a court-ordered fine.

Under current law, a court may request that the Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew a person's motor vehicle registration or driver's license if the person has failed to make satisfactory arrangements for the payment of a court-ordered fine. The court must first schedule a hearing to address the person's nonpayment of the fine and the person must fail to appear at the hearing.

HB1284 prohibits a court from requesting that DFA suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew a person's motor vehicle registration or driver's license due to failure to pay a court-ordered fine.

Fiscal Impact:

Taxpayer Impact:

A taxpayer that has failed to make satisfactory payment arrangements with a court would no longer be subject to suspension, revocation, or nonrenewal of driving privileges or motor vehicle registration.

Training and review sessions will be conducted for State Revenue Office, Office of Driver Services, and Office of Motor Vehicle (DSMV) staff.
