## Impact Assessment for SB6 Sponsored by Senator King

Subtitle TO ADD THE CRIMINAL OFFENSE OF VACCINE HARM.

**Impact Summary**<sup>1</sup> Minimal. While the proposed bill creates a new criminal offense for which the likely number of occurrences is unknown, the statutory elements limit the number of individuals who could potentially commit the newly created offense.

Change from Current Law<sup>2</sup> Amends Title 5 of the Arkansas Code Annotated to create a new criminal offense. Under the proposed bill, a person commits the offense of vaccine harm if: (1) the person is an executive officer for a pharmaceutical company and is eighteen (18) years of age or older, (2) the person introduces into the market a vaccine produced by the pharmaceutical company, (3) the person knowingly hides, conceals, omits, or otherwise withholds evidence, documentation, or information that the vaccine has dangerous effects, (4) another person receives the vaccine in Arkansas through a vaccination containing the vaccine, and (5) the vaccination causes the death of or serious physical injury to the other person.

Under the proposed bill, vaccine harm is an unclassified felony with a sentence of imprisonment of not less than one (1) year and not more than life.

**Impact Information** The proposed bill creates a new criminal offense for which the likely number of occurrences cannot be determined. However, the bill requires that an individual must be an executive officer for a pharmaceutical company. Because this represents a small percentage of the population, the proposed bill is projected to have a minimal impact on correctional resources.
