17	TO AUTHORIZE A PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT TO
18	DELEGATE CERTAIN TASKS.
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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-95-208 is amended to read as follows:
23	17-95-208. Rules on physician's authority to delegate.
24	(a) The Arkansas State Medical Board shall adopt rules that establish
25	standards to be met and procedures to be followed by a physician $or a$
26	physician assistant with respect to the physician's delegation of the
27	performance of medical practices to a qualified and properly trained employee
28	who is not licensed or otherwise specifically authorized by the Arkansas Code
29	to perform the practice.
30	(b) The rules adopted under subsection (a) of this section shall
31	provide that:
32	(1) The delegating physician <u>or a physician assistant</u> remains
33	responsible for the acts of the employee performing the delegated practice;
34	(2) The employee performing the delegated practice shall not be
35	represented to the public as a licensed physician, licensed nurse, licensed
36	physician's assistant, or other licensed healthcare provider; and

1 (3) Medical practices delegated under this section shall be 2 performed under the physician's supervision of the physician or physician 3 assistant. (c) Delegation of medical practices under this section may include 4 5 administration of drugs that do not require substantial specialized judgment 6 and skill based on knowledge and application of the principles of biological, 7 physical, and social sciences as determined by the board. 8 (d) Rules adopted regarding the delegation of the administration of 9 drugs shall provide for: 10 (1) The delegated administration of drugs only within the physical boundaries of the office in which the delegating physician's offices 11 12 physician or physician assistant practices; 13 (2) Evaluation of whether delegation is appropriate according to 14 the acuity of the patient involved; 15 (3) Training and competency requirements that shall be met by 16 the person administering the drugs; and 17 (4) Other standards and procedures the board considers relevant. 18 (e) The board shall not adopt rules that: 19 (1) Authorize a physician to transfer to a health professional 20 other than another a physician or physician assistant the physician's 21 responsibility for supervising a delegated medical practice; 22 (2) Authorize an individual to whom a medical practice is 23 delegated to delegate the performance of that practice to another individual; 24 (3) Authorize a physician to delegate the administration of 25 anesthesia; or 26 (4) (3) Conflict with a provision of the Arkansas Code that 27 specifically authorizes an individual to perform a particular practice. 28 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-105-107, concerning the scope of 29 30 authority and delegatory authority of a physician assistant, is amended to 31 add an additional subsection to read as follows: 32 (e) A physician assistant may delegate certain tasks as authorized 33 under § 17-95-208 and the rules of the Arkansas State Medical Board. 34 35 36 Referred by Senator C.
