25	and immunizations to a person three (3) years of age or older $\underline{\text{or to an infant}}$
26	under subdivision (18)(A)(i)(c)(2) of this section if delegated to do so by a
27	supervising pharmacist, but may not administer other medications.
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29	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-92-101, concerning the definitions
30	relating to pharmacy, pharmacists, and pharmacy technicians, is amended to
31	add additional subdivisions to read as follows:
32	(27) "Infant" means a child less than eight (8) months of age;
33	<u>and</u>
34	(28) "Respiratory syncytial virus disease" means a respiratory
35	infection of the nose, throat, and lungs caused by the respiratory syncytial
36	virus.
