14	farming to become farmers because they do not have the equity needed to get
15	an adequate loan to begin farming operations; and

	UNEDFAC comicultural production will suffer if the state does not make
17	WHEREAS, agricultural production will suffer if the state does not make
18 19	it easier for people to become farmers and support beginning farmers in becoming established; and

21	WHEREAS, providing incentives for beginning farmers and for experienced
22	farmers to help beginning farmers become established in agricultural
23	production would benefit the state; and

	INTERPRACE and the second and the se
25 26	WHEREAS, states have taken various approaches to providing incentives
26	to encourage an increase in the number of beginning farmers; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, some states offer beginning farmer tax credits for farmers who
29	lease or sell their agricultural property or equipment to a beginning farmer;

2	WHEREAS, some states assist beginning farmers in purchasing farmland
3	through the use of agricultural conservation easements; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, at least one (1) state provides down-payment assistance for
6	beginning farmers; and
7	
8	WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the state to increase the
9	number of farmers in the state to ensure the continued production of
10	agricultural products on which the state and the nation rely,
11	
12	NOW THEREFORE,
13	BE IT PROPOSED BY THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY, AND ECONOMIC
14	DEVELOPMENT OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
15	
16	THAT the House Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, and Economic
17	Development study the various incentives the state can offer to increase the
18	number of beginning farmers in the state and the economic impact of the
19	incentives studied.
