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26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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28	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 12, Chapter 1, is amended to add an additional
29	subchapter to read as follows:
30	Subchapter 2 — James McFerron Mental Health, Wellness, and Resiliency Act
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32	12-1-201. Title.
33	This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "James McFerron Mental Health,
34	Wellness, and Resiliency Act".
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36	12-1-202. Legislative findings and intent.

1	(a) The General Assembly finds that:
2	(1) Mental health conditions affect a significant portion of first responders across
3	the state and have long-term impacts on first responders, their families, and the communities they
4	serve;
5	(2) Increased training for peer-to-peer support and access to mental health,
6	leadership, wellness, and resiliency programs and services lead to better mental and physical
7	wellness in our first responders across the state;
8	(3) Mental health, leadership, wellness, and resiliency training and education
9	programs improve a first responder's ability to cope with stress, both on and off duty, trauma, and
10	adversity; and
11	(4) A coordinated effort is needed to address first responder mental health,
12	leadership, wellness, and resiliency disparities amongst state, county, and local agencies and to
13	promote mental health, leadership, wellness, and resiliency.
14	(b) The General Assembly intends this act to provide for mental health, leadership,
15	wellness, and resiliency training programs, services, and resources to be accessible to all first
16	responders across the state, promoting holistic wellness.
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18	12-1-203. Definitions.
19	As used in this subchapter:
20	(1) "Certified peer support member" means a first responder, a retired first
21	responder, or a chaplain who has received training in providing peer-to-peer support and been
22	certified by the Department of Public Safety to provide peer-to-peer support to other first
23	responders;
24	(2) "Chaplain" means a member of the clergy;
25	(3) "First responder" means a person with specialized training who is among the
26	first to arrive and provide assistance or incident resolution at the scene of an emergency, including
27	without limitation a certified law enforcement officer, a firefighter, an emergency medical services
28	provider, a public safety or emergency medical dispatcher, and an employee of a correctional
29	facility; and
30	(4) "Peer-to-peer support" includes without limitation trainings, programs,
31	resources, and emotional and moral support in subjects including without limitation mental health
32	leadership, wellness, resiliency, and critical incident stress management.
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34	12-1-204. Expansion of mental health services.
35	The Department of Public Safety shall develop and provide to first responders in every
36	region of the state:

1	(1) Training to become a certified peer support member; and
2	(2) Programs and resources on subjects including without limitation mental health,
3	leadership, wellness, resiliency, and critical incident stress management.
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5	12-1-205. Peer-to-peer support network.
6	(a) The Department of Public Safety shall:
7	(1) Establish a peer-to-peer support network consisting of volunteers who are
8	certified peer support members;
9	(2) Designate an employee of the department to serve as the coordinator for the
10	peer-to-peer support network; and
11	(3) Work to ensure that members of the peer-to-peer support network are located
12	throughout the state.
13	(b) The department shall coordinate with the members of the peer-to-peer network to:
14	(1) Provide peer-to-peer support to a requesting agency that employs a first
15	responder; and
16	(2) Ensure that peer-to-peer support is accessible to a first responder in the state,
17	regardless of location.
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19	12-1-206. Reporting.
20	The Department of Public Safety shall provide an annual report to the Governor and
21	Legislative Council summarizing the department's activities under this subchapter.
