19	TO AMEND PROVISIONS OF THE ARKANSAS CODE
20	TO IMPROVE EFFICIENCY IN STUDENT
21	INSTRUCTION; AND TO CREATE A
22	STANDARDIZED FLEXIBLE SCHOOL CALENDAR
23	SYSTEM FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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27	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-10-106 is amended to read as follows:
28	6-10-106. Uniform dates for beginning and end of school year —
29	Definition School calendar - Definitions.
30	(a)(1)(A) Each school year, each public school district board of
31	directors and governing entity of an open-enrollment public charter school
32	shall establish by policy the first day of the school year for student
33	attendance in public elementary and secondary schools.
34	(B) The first day of the school year for student
35	attendance established under subdivision (a)(1)(Λ) of this section shall
36	ensure compliance with the number of student teacher interaction days or

- 1 hours required by the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools
 2 and School Districts established by the State Board of Education.
- 3 (2) Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, the first day of
 4 the school year for student attendance in public school districts and open5 enrollment public charter schools shall be on or after July 1.

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- (3) The last day of the school year for student attendance in public school districts and open-enrollment public charter schools shall not be after June 30.
- (2)(4) Labor Day shall be celebrated as a school holiday in all the public school districts of the state and open-enrollment public charter schools, and school shall not be held on that date.
 - (3) As used in this section, "week" means a seven-day period that begins on a Sunday and ends on a Saturday.
 - (b) Contracts of employment for employees in licensed personnel positions and employees in nonlicensed personnel positions of <u>public</u> school districts may require <u>public</u> school district employees to begin performance under their contract of employment before the first day of student attendance.
 - (c)(1) If the school year in any <u>public</u> school <u>district or open-</u>
 <u>enrollment public charter school</u> extends beyond the date observed as Memorial
 Day, such date shall be a holiday in the <u>public</u> school <u>district or open-</u>
 enrollment public charter school.
 - (2) Provided, upon approval of the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, this date may be used as a make-up day in any school district which has unavoidably lost more than five (5) scheduled days of student attendance during the course of the school year due to contagious disease outbreaks, inclement weather, or other acts of God.
 - (d)(1) A public school district <u>or an open-enrollment public charter</u> <u>school</u> that provides a week-long holiday for spring break shall schedule the spring break holiday for five (5) consecutive school days beginning on the Monday of the thirty-eighth week of the school year.
- 32 (2) The thirty-eighth week of the school year shall be 33 calculated by counting as week one the first week in July that begins on a 34 Sunday.
- 35 (3) Nothing in this subsection shall prevent a public school 36 district or an open-enrollment public charter school from providing fewer

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    than five (5) consecutive school days for the spring break holiday to comply
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    with the division's Division of Elementary and Secondary Education's
    requirement for a minimum number of days for student attendance under the
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    Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts.
           (e) The division State Board of Education shall not grant a waiver
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     from the requirements of this section unless this section specifically
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     authorizes the waiver.
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           (f) Except as provided under subsection (g) of this section, a school
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    district shall adopt an academic calendar that includes five (5) make up
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    days, in addition to the number of student-teacher interaction days required
    by the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School
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    Districts established by the state board, for days unavoidably lost due to
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    exceptional or emergency circumstances resulting from a contagious disease
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    outbreak, inclement weather, or other acts of God.
           (g)(1) Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, a public school
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    district board of directors may elect to implement an alternate school
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    calendar.
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                 (2)(A) An alternate school calendar implemented under
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    subdivision (g)(1) of this section shall consist of:
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                             (i) At least one thousand sixty-eight (1,068) hours
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    of instructional time; and
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                             (ii)(a) At least thirty (30) make-up hours, in
    addition to the number of hours required of instructional time, for days
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    unavoidably lost due to exceptional or emergency circumstances resulting from

    inclement weather.
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                                   (b) If additional make-up hours are needed,
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    the public school district board of directors shall modify its alternate
    school calendar to include make up hours for the additional hours needed.
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                       (B) However, there shall not be a minimum number of school
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    days required to meet the required one thousand sixty-eight (1,068) hours of
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    instructional time.
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                 (3)(A) A public school district board of directors that elects
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    to implement an alternate school calendar under subdivision (g)(1) of this
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    section shall:
                             (i) Notify the division by July 1 of each year that
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    the public school district intends to implement the alternate school
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1	calendar;
2	(ii) Post the alternate school calendar on the
3	public school district's website by August 1 of each year that the public
4	school district intends to implement the alternate school calendar; and
5	(iii) Input into eSchool, eFinance, or the Arkansas
6	Public School Computer Network all data that:
7	(a) Affects the average daily membership of
8	the public school district; and
9	(b) Ensures compliance with the required
10	minimum number of school instructional hours under subdivision $(g)(2)(A)(i)$
11	of this section.
12	(B) A public school district that implements an alternate
13	school calendar under subdivision (g)(l) of this section may submit an
14	application to operate a virtual learning option.
15	(4) The total number of instructional hours under an alternate
16	school calendar shall be converted to school days for purposes of the:
17	(A) Number of days required in a teacher employment basic
18	contract under § 6-17-2402(1);
19	(B) Number of days counted during the official reporting
20	period for attendance under § 6-18-213(b)(1); and
21	(C) Average daily membership calculated under § 6-20-
22	2303(3).
23	(5) The division may promulgate rules as necessary to administer
24	this section.
25	(f) Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, each public school
26	district board of directors and open-enrollment public charter school
27	governing body shall adopt a school calendar that includes:
28	(1) On-site, in-person instruction for a minimum of the
29	<u>following:</u>
30	(A) One hundred sixty (160) school days or the hourly
31	equivalent of one hundred sixty (160) school days for a public school with an
32	"A" school rating according to the most recent results of the school rating
33	system under § 6-15-2101 et seq. or any other division-approved
34	accountability system;
35	(B) One hundred sixty-four (164) school days or the hourly
36	equivalent of one hundred sixty-four (164) school days for a public school

1	with a "B" school rating according to the most recent results of the school
2	rating system under § 6-15-2101 et seq. or any other division-approved
3	accountability system;
4	(C) One hundred sixty-eight (168) school days or the
5	hourly equivalent of one hundred sixty-eight (168) school days for a public
6	school with a "C" school rating according to the most recent results of the
7	\underline{school} rating system under § 6-15-2101 et seq. or any other division-approved
8	accountability system;
9	(D) One hundred seventy-two (172) school days or the
10	hourly equivalent of one hundred seventy-two (172) school days for a public
11	school with a "D" school rating according to the most recent results of the
12	school rating system under § 6-15-2101 et seq. or any other division-approved
13	accountability system; and
14	(E) One hundred seventy-eight (178) school days or the
15	hourly equivalent of one hundred seventy-eight (178) for a public school with
16	an "F" school rating according to the most recent results of the school
17	rating system under § 6-15-2101 et seq. or any other division-approved
18	accountability system;
19	(2) A minimum of one hundred ninety (190) teacher contract days;
20	<u>and</u>
21	(3) At least thirty (30) make-up instructional hours in addition
22	to the number of on-site, in-person instruction time required under
23	subdivision (f)(1) of this section, which shall be used to make up school
24	days missed due to exceptional or emergency circumstances resulting from:
25	(A) A contagious disease outbreak;
26	(B) Inclement weather;
27	(C) A utility outage;
28	(D) A reasonable and substantial threat to the safety and
29	security of the public school district or open-enrollment public charter
30	school; or
31	(E) Other acts of God.
32	(g)(1) Each public school district and open-enrollment public charter
33	school shall remain open for on-site, in-person instruction for the minimum
34	number of days required for the public school district or open-enrollment
35	public charter school as provided under subdivision (f)(1) of this section,
36	unless the public school district or open-enrollment public charter school is

1	closed for a reason under subdivision (f)(3) of this section.
2	(2) The requirement that a public school district or an open-
3	enrollment public charter school be open for on-site, in-person instruction
4	under subdivision (g)(l) of this section does not apply to an approved
5	virtual school.
6	(h)(1) A public school district superintendent or director of an open-
7	enrollment public charter school may close school, delay the school day start
8	time, or release students early during a regularly scheduled school day due
9	to exceptional or emergency circumstances resulting from:
10	(A) A contagious disease outbreak;
11	(B) Inclement weather;
12	(C) A utility outage;
13	(D) A reasonable and substantial threat to the safety and
14	security of the public school district or open-enrollment public charter
15	school; or
16	(E) Other acts of God.
17	(2) If a public school district superintendent or director of an
18	open-enrollment public charter school closes school, delays the school day
19	start time, or releases students early during a regularly scheduled school
20	day under subdivision (h)(1) of this section, then the public school district
21	or open-enrollment public charter school shall make up the missed
22	instructional time in order to meet the on-site, in-person instruction time
23	requirements under subdivision (f)(l)(B) of this section by:
24	(A) Utilizing the thirty (30) make-up instructional hours
25	built into the school calendar as required under subdivision (f)(3) of this
26	section; or
27	(B) Otherwise modifying the school calendar to include
28	make-up instructional time for the additional instructional time that is
29	needed.
30	(i)(1) For purposes of a school day, at least forty (40) minutes of
31	instructional time per school day shall be used for recess during the school
32	day for students attending public elementary schools.
33	(2) Recess shall:
34	(A) Consist of supervised social time during which public
35	school students may communicate with each other;
36	(B) Occur outdoors when weather and other relevant

1	conditions permit; and
2	(C) Include without limitation opportunities for free play
3	and vigorous physical activity, regardless of whether recess occurs indoors
4	or outdoors.
5	(3) A public elementary school principal may adjust recess time
6	required under this subsection (i) due to special circumstances or programs
7	that interrupt a regular school day.
8	(4) A public elementary school may seek approval from the
9	division to provide recess in an alternative method by submitting a request
10	to the division.
11	(j) Each public school district and open-enrollment public charter
12	<pre>school shall:</pre>
13	(1) Post the school calendar on the website of the public school
14	district or open-enrollment public charter school by July 1 each year; and
15	(2) Provide to the division, in the format prescribed by the
16	division, all data that:
17	(A) Affects the average daily membership of the public
18	school district or open-enrollment public charter school; and
19	(B) Ensures compliance with this section.
20	(k) The division may promulgate rules to implement this section.
21	(1) As used in this section:
22	(1)(A) "School day" means a day on which classes are in session
23	and students are on-site, in-person, and receiving instruction at a public
24	school district or open-enrollment public charter school.
25	(B)(i) Any day during which less than six (6) hours of
26	instructional time are provided to students shall be counted as one-half
27	(1/2) of a school day if at least three (3) hours of instructional time are
28	provided to students.
29	(ii) A day in which less than three (3) hours of
30	instructional time are provided to students shall not be counted as any part
31	of a school day; and
32	(2) "Week" means a seven-day period that begins on a Sunday and
33	ends on a Saturday.
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35	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-10-108 is amended to read as follows:
36	6-10-108. Twelve-month school year — Definition.

(a) It is found and determined by the General Assembly that public school facilities in the state are now effectively utilized only nine (9) or ten (10) months each year and that such facilities could be more efficiently utilized and educational opportunities in the various school districts could be enhanced by the establishment and operation of educational programs on a twelve (12) month per year basis. It is therefore the intent and purpose of this section to authorize public schools to initiate and maintain public school educational programs on a twelve month basis.

- (b) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires, "twelve month year-round educational program" means an educational program in which all students attend school no less than the number of days required by the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts between July 1 and June 30 of each school year and in which no vacation, including summer, lasts more than seven (7) weeks.
- (c)(1) The board of directors of any school district is authorized to initiate and maintain a twelve-month year-round educational program in any or all of the public schools in the school district.
- (2) However, any school district which does not elect to operate on a twelve-month basis must start school in accordance with the provisions of \S 6-10-106.
- (d)(1)(a) The State Board of Education is authorized to may establish appropriate standards, guidelines, and rules for the determination of average daily membership of <u>public</u> school districts and for the distribution of state foundation funding and other forms of state aid and financial assistance to each local school district that elects to operate the public schools of the <u>public</u> school district on a twelve-month basis, in order to provide the school district with an equitable share of the state foundation funds designated to equate a twelve-month school operation by the <u>public</u> school district to the educational opportunities provided by a <u>public</u> school district offering nine (9) months of public school instruction.
- (2)(b) However, the A public school district shall not receive any more state foundation funding for offering twelve (12) months of public school instruction than it would have received for offering nine (9) months of public school instruction.

1	b-10-11/. Four-day school week - Delinition.
2	(a) It is found and determined by the General Assembly that granting
3	local school districts greater flexibility in scheduling instructional time
4	can reap educational benefits for the students and financial rewards for the
5	school district. It is the intent of this section to authorize local school
6	districts to initiate and maintain public school educational programs on a
7	four-day school-week basis, so long as planned instructional time is in
8	accord with requirements established by the State Board of Education.
9	(b) As used in this section, "four-day school week" means an
10	educational program in which all students attend school for four (4) days a
11	week but no fewer than the total number of hours required by the Standards
12	for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts in a five-
13	day school week.
14	(e) The board of directors of any school district is authorized to
15	initiate and maintain a four-day school week in any or all of the public
16	schools in the school district.
17	(d)(1) The State Board of Education shall establish appropriate
18	standards, guidelines, and rules for the determination of average daily
19	membership of school districts and for the distribution of state aid to each
20	local school district that elects to operate any or all of the public schools
21	of its school district on a four-day school week basis, to provide the school
22	district with an equitable share of aid funds designated to equate a four-day
23	school-week operation by the school district to the educational opportunities
24	provided by a school district offering a five-day school week.
25	(2) Provided, however, that a school district shall not receive
26	any more state financial aid for offering a four day school week of
27	instruction than it would have received for offering a five-day school week
28	of instruction.
29	
30	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-10-126 is repealed.
31	6-10-126. Delay or early release of school due to emergency
32	eireumstances.
33	(a) A superintendent may delay the start time or release early a
34	school or schools in the school district due to any of the following
35	emergency circumstances:

(1) Inclement weather;

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1	(2) Contagious disease outbreak; or
2	(3) Utility outage.
3	(b)(1) For no more than five (5) school days total per year, a
4	superintendent may, due to emergency circumstances under subsection (a) of
5	this section, either:
6	(A) Delay the start of the school day until as late as
7	10:00 a.m.; or
8	(B) Release students from school no earlier than 1:00 p.m
9	(2) A school day that is delayed or released early under
10	subdivision (b)(1) of this section shall count as a credited school day, with
11	no requirement for additional days to be added to the school calendar.
12	
13	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-10-127 is repealed.
14	6-10-127. Making up missed school days.
15	(a) If a superintendent closes school for a regularly scheduled school
16	day due to exceptional or emergency circumstances such as a contagious
17	disease outbreak, inclement weather, or other acts of God, the superintenden
18	may make up missed school days by adding time to the beginning or ending of
19	regular school day for a minimum of sixty (60) minutes.
20	(b)(1) The Commissioner of Elementary and Secondary Education may
21	grant up to the equivalent of ten (10) student attendance days for public
22	school districts that have an alternative instruction plan approved by the
23	commissioner for the use of alternative methods of instruction, including
24	without limitation virtual learning, on days when the public school district
25	is closed due to exceptional or emergency circumstances such as:
26	(A) A contagious disease outbreak, inclement weather, or
27	other acts of God; or
28	(B) A utility outage.
29	(2) The public school district's alternative instruction plan
30	shall demonstrate how teaching and learning in the public school district
31	will not be negatively impacted by the use of alternative methods of
32	instruction under subdivision (b)(1) of this section.
33	
34	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-15-202(f)(15), concerning written
35	statements from school districts to the Commissioner of Elementary and
36	Secondary Education that confirm compliance with certain statutory

1	requirements, is amended to read as follows:

4	SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 6-16-102 is repealed.
5	6-16-102. School day - Definition.
6	$(a)(1)(\Lambda)$ Except as provided under subdivision $(a)(1)(B)$ of this
7	section, as used in this section, "school day" shall mean a day in which
8	classes are in session and students receive at least six (6) hours of
9	instructional time.
10	(B) However, "school day" for purposes of a public school
11	district that implements an alternate school calendar under § 6-10-106(g)
12	means a day in which classes are in session and students are under the
13	guidance and direction of a teacher or public school employee.
14	(2)(A) Any day in which less than six (6) hours of instructional
15	time are provided to students shall be counted as one-half (1/2) of a school
16	day if at least three (3) hours of instructional time are provided to

18	(B) However, subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this section shall
19	not apply to a public school district that implements an alternate school
20	ealendar under § 6-10-106(g).

22	instructional time are provided to students shall not be counted as any part
23	of a school day.
24	(B) However, subdivision (a)(3)(A) of this section shall
25	not apply to a public school district that implements an alternate school
26	calendar under § 6-10-106(g).
27	(4) A school district may include as part of the school day the
28	travel time between public schools or other educational programs of those
29	students attending classes or programs authorized by law.
30	(5)(A) At least forty (40) minutes of instructional time per
31	school day shall be used for recess during the school day for students
32	attending public elementary schools.
33	(B) Recess shall:
34	(i) Consist of supervised, unstructured social time
35	during which public school students may communicate with each other;
36	(ii) Occur outdoors when weather and other relevant

1	conditions permit; and
2	(iii) Include without limitation opportunities for
3	free play and vigorous physical activity, regardless of whether recess occurs
4	indoors or outdoors.
5	(C) The remaining instructional hours required under this
6	section shall be distributed across academic content areas as determined by a
7	public school district's board of directors.
8	(D) A public school principal may use discretion to adjust
9	recess time required under this section due to special circumstances or
10	programs that interrupt a regular school day.
11	(E)(i) A public elementary school may seek a waiver from
12	the requirements under this subdivision (a)(5) if the public elementary
13	school:
14	(a) Submits to the Division of Elementary and
15	Secondary Education for approval an alternative plan for recess that:
16	(1) Exceeds the required minimum amount
17	of minutes combined for physical activity under § 6-16-132 and recess under
18	this section; and
19	(2) Provides for both structured and
20	unstructured social time; or
21	(b) Is approved by the division to operate as
22	a virtual school.
23	(ii) Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, the
24	division shall provide to the House Committee on Education and the Senate
25	Committee on Education each year for three (3) years a report that details
26	the following:
27	(a) Which public elementary schools have been
28	granted a waiver under subdivision (a)(5)(E)(i) of this section; and
29	(b) How many waivers have been granted by the
30	division under subdivision (a)(5)(E)(i) of this section.
31	(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, the State Board of
32	Education shall promulgate rules to prescribe the credit to be given students
33	for attending school for only a portion of a school day because the school is
34	closed due to emergency circumstances which would be hazardous to the health

9	SECTION 8. Arkansas Code \S 6-17-2403(c), concerning the requirements a

11	to be eligible for funds to implement salary increases under the Teacher
12	Compensation Program of 2003, is amended to read as follows:
13	(c) To be eligible for funds to implement the salary increases under
14	subsections (a) and (b) of this section, each public school district and
15	open-enrollment public charter school shall be open for on-site, in-person
16	instruction for at least:
17	(1) One hundred seventy-eight (178) days; or One hundred sixty
18	(160) school days or the hourly equivalent of one hundred sixty (160) school
19	days for a public school with an "A" school rating according to the most
20	recent results of the school rating system under § 6-15-2101 et seq. or any
21	other accountability system approved by the Division of Elementary and
22	Secondary Education;
23	(2) One thousand sixty-eight (1,068) hours One hundred sixty-
24	four (164) school days or the hourly equivalent of one hundred sixty-four
25	(164) school days for a public school with a "B" school rating according to
26	the most recent results of the school rating system under § 6-15-2101 et seq.
27	or any other accountability system approved by the Division of Elementary and
28	Secondary Education;
29	(3) One hundred sixty-eight (168) school days or the hourly
30	equivalent of one hundred sixty-eight (168) school days for a public school
31	with a "C" school rating according to the most recent results of the school
32	rating system under § 6-15-2101 et seq. or any other accountability system
33	approved by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education;
34	(4) One hundred seventy-two (172) school days or the hourly
35	equivalent of one hundred seventy-two (172) school days for a public school
36	with a "D" school rating according to the most recent results of the school

1 rating system under § 6-15-2101 et seq. or any other accountability system 2 approved by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education; and 3 (5) One hundred seventy-eight (178) school days or the hourly 4 equivalent of one hundred seventy-eight (178) for a public school with an "F" school rating according to the most recent results of the school rating 5 6 system under § 6-15-2101 et seq. or any other accountability system approved 7 by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education. 8 9 SECTION 9. 7	(1) Preclude a student who has met all graduation requirements
8	from graduating early; or
9	(2) Require a student who has graduated early from high school
10	to continue to attend school.
11	(e) The State Board of Education may promulgate rules to implement

14	SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § $6-18-2503(6)$, concerning the definition of
