Re: Arkansas Department of Agriculture, Forestry Division's monthly activity report for December 2020

Dear Senator Bledsoe and Representative Wardlaw:

Per Section 33 of Act 544 of the 2019 General Session, the Arkansas Forestry Commission (AFC) is to report monthly fiscal and agency activities to the Arkansas Legislative Council. Please find attached the report for December 2020.

In December, forestry crews suppressed 78 wildfires that burned 1,304 acres. For 2020, forestry suppressed 573 wildfires that burned 11,010 acres. This is the lowest wildfire occurrence in the 85 years of Forestry.

Four of the last thirteen years have been the lowest wildfire occurrence years in history. Statistically speaking, Arkansas is headed for a dry or drought year that can allow for greater wildfire occurrences.

In order to be prepared for a dry year recruitment of new employees, new equipment and training of all employees are priorities of the Forestry Division in 2021.

# Arkansas Department of Agriculture Forestry Division December 2020 Activity and Fiscal Report

## **EMERGENCY SERVICES**

**Wildfires:** During December a total of 78 wildfires were suppressed for a total of 1,304 acres burned. Ten-year average for the month of December is 58 wildfires 770 acres burned.

**Rural Fire Protection:** Rural Fire Protection (RFP) assists fire departments (FDs) with organization, training and equipment. RFP provides interest-free loans, secures firefighting and emergency service equipment from the federal government and administers a federal grant to assist approximately 925 fire departments. The RFP shop provides maintenance and refurbishment to federal property destined for FDs and repairs Department of Agriculture equipment as well.

#### December 2020:

- There were two Wildland Fire Suppression training classes conducted with seven FDs (twenty-eight firefighters), including one Forestry personnel in attendance.
- One aircraft, one fire truck, one brush truck, one service truck, one haz-mat decon trailer, four generators and seven toolboxes were issued this month (original acquisition cost (o.a.c.) \$611,495.82).
- RFP received one thousand six hundred fifty items from the Department of Defense (DOD) Recycling Control Point (RCP) to include tools, field sacks, tourniquets, heating blankets, boots and other firefighting equipment (o.a.c. \$116,499.07)
- The RFP shop completed maintenance on six Forestry vehicles and two FD vehicles (labor savings of \$8,500.00).
- The drivers made several in-state trips along with three out-of-state trips to include Ft. Sill, OK; Eglin, FL and Red River, TX.
- 2021 Fire Show contract has been signed and submitted to Conway Expo Center along with the 2<sup>nd</sup> day deposit of \$500. They will roll over deposit from 2020 into next year's show (\$1,000). Dates: October 1st (set-up day), October 2<sup>nd</sup> (show day); Extended time 9am-3pm.
- Attended the Fire Protection Services Board Meeting 12/9. Amending the title from a "board" to a "commission".

**Firewise:** Firewise staff and district personnel work with fire departments and civic organizations to make communities safer from the threat of wildfire through mitigation projects

and community education initiatives. Arkansas is one of the top states with 96 active Firewise communities. Recognized communities display Firewise signs at the city limits.

Firewise achieved the following in December:

- Delivered recognition signage and trophies to newest community.
- Worked with multiple communities to finalize 2020 renewal submissions.
- Firewise efforts by personnel across the state include: four grant presentations, eleven Fire Chief visits, seventeen paperwork assists, three literature distributions, two landowner assists and one educational exhibit.

Law Enforcement: The department has the authority to enforce the laws of the State of Arkansas, but primarily focuses on unlawful dumping, timber theft, forest fires and forestry equipment theft and vandalism. The Department aggressively seeks prosecution of violators to deter such crimes. The Department Investigators and district law enforcement officers opened nine timber theft cases, four unlawful dumping cases, two forest fire cases and one AFC Property. They closed 0 cases in December.

#### FOREST MANAGEMENT

Forest Stewardship/Rural Forestry Assistance Programs: The Forestry Division works with a diverse group of partners and professionals to conserve, protect and enhance Arkansas's forests. The Forest Stewardship Program (FSP) is an opportunity for non-industrial private forest landowners who are interested in managing their property for wildlife, recreation, soil and water conservation, agro-forestry and\or for timber production to get a comprehensive multiple use forest management plan that is prepared by private consulting or Division foresters, private consulting or Arkansas Game and Fish Commission (AGFC) private lands wildlife biologists, and United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) soil and water professionals. Arkansas has 323,501 acres of private land actively enrolled in the Forest Stewardship Program. Landowners that implement practices under their FSP management plans become Certified Forest Stewards. There are 1,264 Forest Stewards owning 285,087 acres in the State.

During the month of December, one Forest Stewardship management plan was prepared for 137 acres. In addition, Forestry Division personnel provide technical assistance through the rural forestry program to landowners that are enrolled in USDA tree planting and forest management programs such as the Conservation Reserve Program, Environmental Quality Incentives Program, Wetland Reserve Program, and the Southern Pine Beetle Prevention and Restoration Program. Forestry Division personnel prepared 51 forest management practice plans on 3,309 acres and conducted 13 prescribed burns on 653 acres.

**Urban & Community Forestry Assistance:** Urban & Community Forestry Program staff provide assistance and training to communities, educational institutions, non-profit organizations, developers and homeowners on urban tree care, inventory and management.

Urban achieved the following in December:

- Shade Trees on Playgrounds (STOP) Ceremonies/Tree Plantings were held at Clinton Primary School in Hope, Raymond & Phyllis Simon Middle School in Conway, and Parkway Elementary School in Alexander. Due to COVID restrictions, ceremonies were held via Zoom or were limited in scope, but all trees were successfully planted, and students participated in curriculum about skin cancer prevention and the benefits of planting and maintaining community trees.
- Tree City USA communities continued holding Arbor Day ceremonies and submitting their Tree City applications for the 2020 year. Communities were granted extensions to the December 31<sup>st</sup> deadline on a case-by-case basis to allow as many cities as possible to renew, even if they were having difficulties with completing paperwork due to municipal staff being out due to COVID. It is anticipated that all 2019 Tree City USA communities will be able to again achieve recognition.
- 100 maple leaf oak seedlings from the Bluff City facility were delivered to the Garland County Master Gardeners for demo projects and personal plantings to help cultivate the species.
- Krissy Kimbro Thomason gave a presentation on pruning for Arkansas Forestry Association's Women Owning Woodlands lunch and learn program.

**Forest Health:** The Forest Health Specialist assists Forestry Division personnel statewide in efforts to maintain healthy, productive forest ecosystems by preventing, detecting, monitoring and suppressing damaging insects and diseases. AR Department of Agriculture – Forestry Division offers technical assistance to landowners who encounter forest health issues.

- The Forestry Division is actively participating in the White Oak Initiative, an interagency group focused on the preservation of the white oak resource. The Forestry Division has collected white oak acorns for the Initiative's research to develop an improved seedling.

**Reforestation:** The Forestry Division's tree improvement program strives to provide landowners with the highest possible genetic gain in pine and hardwood seed. One method The Forestry Division employs to achieve this objective is by establishing the highest genetic gain material in our newest pine and hardwood seed orchards. The Forestry Division's Baucum Nursery then makes available to landowners the improved varieties of pine and hardwood, which are the net result of the tree improvement program.

**Baucum Nursery:** The Forestry Division's Baucum Nursery produces hardwood and pine seedlings for reforestation and afforestation efforts.

Regular season seedling sales began on July 16:

- 2021 (Total through December 31)
  - o 687 total orders
  - o Total sales of 985,725 pine and 4,571,375 hardwood
- 2020 Comparatively

- o 428 total orders
- o Total sales of 893,025 pine and 6,553,200 hardwood
- Lifted and packed the following
  - o 1,070,669 hardwood
  - o 9,300 Containerized 3-star loblolly pine
  - o 9,275 Containerized Advanced Gen shortleaf pine
  - o Total seedlings packed = 1,089,244
- Shipped the following
  - o 240,000 hardwood

During the month of December, Baucum Nursery staff completed the following:

- Completed moving irrigation pipe from fields 2, 7 and 8 to storage.
- Performed general maintenance on both lifters in preparation for lifting season.
- Bush hogged cherrybark oak progeny test.
- Picked up black walnut seed in Marshall.

**Tree Improvement:** The Forestry Division's tree improvement program provides landowners with the highest possible genetic gain in pine and hardwood seed.

During the month of December, the Bluff City Tree Improvement staff completed the following:

- Pruned orchards 1719, 1720 and 1721.
- Double disked Hope test site in preparation for 2<sup>nd</sup> test planting.
- Inventoried hardwood grafts for scion request.
- Inventoried pine grafts for planting.
- Packed and shipped maple leaf oak to Hot Springs County for Urban Forestry.
- Processed controlled cross pinecones.
- Put out gopher bait in orchards 1719, 1720 and 172.1

**Best Management Practices (BMP):** The Forestry Division provides BMP training to loggers and timber companies, conducts courtesy exams prior or during timber harvest operations and addresses logging complaints.

BMP achieved the following in December:

- Inspected a forest road with repair work done by logging contractor from older complaint in Nevada County.
- Inspected a new complaint from Saline County and spoke with landowners within the area. Complaint was found to be non-valid.
- Inspected a new complaint from Union County. Made contact with landowner and logging contractor for repair work needed to site during upcoming work plans.
- Spoke with Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) on the complaint in Union County. They assisted with information and guidelines to get site within BMP compliance.
- Planned for 319(h) grant application for 2021.

Forest Inventory and Analysis (FIA): Forestry Division in cooperation with the USDA Forest Service Southern Research Station is responsible for collecting scientific data from permanently established plots located all over the state. The plots, each representing 5,937 acres, are strategically located on a three-mile by three-mile grid. The inventory plots have been generating data since they were established in the 1950's. Natural resource managers use the data to make management decisions and follow Arkansas's natural resource trends through time.

FIA completed 73 plots for the month of December. Field work for Inventory 2020 is now complete.
