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WIC Modernization Grant Summary

USDA FNS Federal Regulations requires all WIC Program participants to receive consultation with a WIC Registered Dietitian (RD) within 45 calendar days when the participants are determined to be at high-risk nutritionally based on the federally regulated WIC nutrition risk factors. Over the past three years, the Arkansas WIC Program experienced a severe decline in RD staff and have been unable to provide adequate coverage to meet the USDA FNS federal regulations for consultation of high-risk participants. Implementing telehealth services would be the most cost-effective way to utilize current RD staff without increasing travel time and expenses to send staff to the various 90 local health department offices as there are only 13 RDs to provide high-risk nutrition coverage for the entire state of Arkansas.

The Arkansas WIC Program would like to use these funds to implement a telehealth platform for highrisk nutrition assessment appointments, breastfeeding peer counselor appointments, and remote certification appointments when necessary. The telehealth system can also be used by WIC Vendor Liaisons to assist participants in the store while shopping. Due to the critical staffing shortage, specifically with Registered Dietitians, a telehealth platform will allow WIC staff to see more participants in a shorter amount of time as well as provide flexibility to those participants who need remote services for varied reasons. A telehealth platform will allow WIC staff to see participants in almost any setting and will be a valuable resource for the Arkansas WIC Program. The program would like a platform that allows for scheduling future appointments, instant chat features, provides screen and document sharing, is HIPPA compliant, and provides real time data and reporting so the WIC Program can monitor the effectiveness of this video platform and adjust as needed. To start, the program plans to train 96 staff throughout the State. Once a baseline of use is determined, the program can look at training more CPAs and clerical staff.

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Growing Access to Cutting-Edge Cancer Care for Western Arkansas at Mercy Fort Smith

Summary of Request to the State of Arkansas

In February 2024, the Arkansas Legislative Council approved an ARPA award to Mercy Health Foundation Fort Smith of \$12M specifically toward the construction of a free-standing off-campus cancer center in Fort Smith. As this project has evolved to include both on- and off-campus options, and we complete our due diligence in determining the most responsible path forward, we are grateful for the State of Arkansas' willingness to continue with us in support of expanding access to the cutting-edge cancer care the region needs and deserves. Mercy will match funds from the State of Arkansas, applying them to a combination of equipment, facility planning and/or construction expenses, and will expend these funds prior to December 31, 2026.

Background

Mercy Fort Smith has been an integral part of the health of our region since the first Sisters of Mercy arrived here in 1853. Today, we serve nearly a half-million people providing comprehensive primary, specialized, and acute medical services for a significant portion of western Arkansas and eastern Oklahoma. Since 2008, Mercy has invested more than \$400M in the healthcare infrastructure of this region to grow medical access in a region historically and significantly underserved.

Looking to the near future, we have opportunity to transform one of the most challenging specialty services in our entire region—cancer care—but we need the help of our community and partners to do it.

Right now, more than 5,000 residents in the River Valley region are newly diagnosed with cancer each year. In the last decade, as other regional cancer care providers have either reduced their capacity (Baptist Health Fort Smith) or even shuttered their doors (Cancer Treatment Centers of America-Tulsa), Mercy Fort Smith has grown access three-fold attempting to meet the communities' need. The result, though, is that cancer care has been spread over multiple locations across our campus and our physical capacity to serve more patients is exhausted. Ultimately, 30-40% of these newly diagnosed cancer patients must still leave our service area for care, most due to limitations in access.

The COVID-19 pandemic only served to exacerbate the situation. Patients who already struggled with financial, transportation and other barriers endured even greater hardship with many either delaying or foregoing timely screening and care altogether. Today, this means an even more significant bolus of cancer patients (delays, out-migration, annual growth) need expanded access to service—a volume that the region's healthcare infrastructure isn't prepared to handle. Additionally, for those able to access our services, the experience of a disconnected footprint often leads to confusion and stress, missed appointments, travel through other sick-patient areas of the facility, etc.—burdens that cancer patients don't need to bear.

Solution

Mercy is committed to finding the right solution to overcome this challenge. Over the last few years, we have explored multiple plans for how we might both simplify and expand the footprint of our cancer services in a way that ultimately meets the needs of patients across our region for many years to come. Working with HKS, a top-tier design firm based in Dallas with global experience in the healthcare industry, we are in the final stages of vetting two options: 1) expansion/consolidation of oncology services within the footprint of our existing flagship campus, 2) phased construction of a free-standing off-site cancer center near the existing campus. Of important note, either option will:

- provide for the desired growth in providers: we are already actively recruiting to more than double our current medical oncology and radiation oncology providers and to add surgical oncology specialists
- incorporate identical technology: plans include upgraded and additional linear accelerators; advanced radiation, mammography and imaging modalities; additional infusion chairs and more
- expand patient access to meet delayed, out-migration and growth needs: more providers, support staff and technology that, paired with an expanded footprint, will effectively double our patient panel capacity

These options include facility renovation/expansion ranging up to 90,000 square feet and estimated cost up to \$80M. Final option selection will be dependent on combined funding availability through Mercy ministry and philanthropic support. Specific facility planning and equipment purchases will continue through 2024 with construction intended to commence in the coming calendar year.
