Work Plan and Project Description:

At the beginning of the Arkansas Abandoned Mine Land Program, there were over 10,000 acres of abandoned surface coal mine features and 25,000 acres of abandoned underground coal mines in west central Arkansas. Approximately 4,800 acres of abandoned coal mine features, which are classified as Priority I, II or adjacent III, totaling an estimated cost of \$16,500,000 remain to be reclaimed. This does not include the potential dangerous occurrences associated with underground mines, i.e., subsidence, and as yet unknown locations of mine openings. All the areas have the potential to be a threat to the health and safety of the citizens that reside or travel through them. The greater part of the Arkansas coal fields, and thus most of the abandoned mined lands problems, are located along the Arkansas River Valley, a major population center and transportation corridor of west-central Arkansas.

The Mining Program has identified those unclaimed and abandoned mine sites that need to be remediated. Health and safety hazards that may exist as unclaimed or abandoned mine sites.

Attachment 1 - Project Description

Brownfields are real property, the expansion, development or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant. This agreement provides funding under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) to the State of Arkansas. The recipient will conduct eligible assessment-related activities as authorized by Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERLCA) 104(k)(2) in various communities in the State of Arkansas. Specifically, this agreement will provide funding to the recipient to inventory, characterize, assess, and conduct cleanup planning and community involvement related activities. Additionally, the recipient will competitively procure (as needed) and direct a Qualified Environmental Professional to conduct environmental site activities. Also, the recipient will report on interim progress and final accomplishments by completing and submitting relevant portions of the Property Profile Form using Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA's) Assessment, Cleanup and Redevelopment Exchange System (ACRES). The Community-wide Assessment Grant (CWAG) for States and Tribes will support site assessments, cleanup planning, community involvement, and inventory building activities under the Arkansas Brownfield Program, which aims to facilitate the redevelopment of brownfield sites in Arkansas. Over the grant period, the Arkansas Brownfield Program plans to provide 15 Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESAs), 10 Phase II ESAs or Comprehensive Site Assessments (CSAs), 15 Hazardous Building Materials Surveys, and 5 Cleanup Plans to eligible entities. Additionally, the funding will be used to support local brownfield inventory development and community involvement efforts to ensure that site selection and reuse aligns with each community's vision and priorities. No subawards are included in this assistance agreement.
