MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ARKANSAS OFFICE OF SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

ASSURANCES AND COMPLIANCE: This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of Arkansas. The parties agree to comply with Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Executive Order 11246, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and the related regulations to each. Each Party assures that it will not discriminate against any individual on the basis of race, religion, creed, color, sex, age, disability, veteran status, or national origin. Nothing in this MOU may be construed to waive the sovereign or statutory immunities of either Party.

PERIOD COVERED: This MOU shall take effect on May 17, 2024, or the date signed by both Parties. The MOU shall continue through September 30, 2026.

PARTIES: Parties to this MOU are the Arkansas Office of Skills Development (OSD) and the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas, Acting on Behalf of the University of Arkansas Fort Smith (UAFS). OSD is a state agency authorized to award strategic grants to public and private organizations for the development and implementation of workforce training programs in Arkansas. The University of Arkansas Fort Smith is a four-year, state-funded institution that serves to advance the profession of nursing by preparing graduates to meet ever-changing client needs for health care.

BACKGROUND: The State of Arkansas has recognized the challenge that the healthcare industry faces due to the nursing shortage that exists across the United States. OSD and Arkansas institutions of higher education have been empowered to design, develop, and implement innovative programs to fill this ever-increasing gap through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 for the Arkansas Linking Industry to Grow Nurses (ALIGN) Program. This grant program is aimed at upskilling lower-level professionals, expanding nursing apprenticeships, increasing nurse educator recruitment and retention, expanding clinical rotations, increasing nursing program capacity where relevant, reimbursing tuition, purchasing equipment, implementing simulation centers, and expanding labs. Each institution is required to provide a healthcare partner contribution, with a two-to-one match by the state for every dollar contributed.

PURPOSE OF MOU: To provide funding through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 for the *ALIGN Program* at UAFS.

FUNDING: The approved budget which is incorporated into this MOU shows all eligible expenses for reimbursement by OSD. OSD will reimburse UAFS on a monthly basis for expenses corresponding to the budget categories. Invoicing for reimbursement should be submitted by the 15th of each month for the preceding month's expenses.

Invoices and supporting documents shall be submitted to OSD, Bonnie Casey at bonnie.b.casey@arkansas.gov.

PROGRAM REPORTING:

UAFS will provide reports to OSD at the end of each semester (including summer sessions), or as reasonably requested by OSD. These reports shall contain:

- Healthcare Partner Contribution
- Total expenditures including equipment, salaries, and tuition reimbursement
- Number of students enrolled in each program (LPN, RN, BSN)
- Number of students attaining degree each semester
- Student Wages during training
- Employment Outcomes and Wages at the end of training

INFORMATION EXCHANGE AND CONFIDENTIALITY: The Parties agree to abide by the privacy and nondisclosure provisions of the Family Educational Rights Privacy Act, its associated federal regulations, and Arkansas privacy laws to the extent they apply.

MODIFICATION: This MOU may be modified only by written agreement signed by both Parties.

OSD and Arkansas institutions of higher education have been empowered to design, develop, and implement innovative programs to fill this ever-increasing gap through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 for the *Arkansas Linking Industry to Grow Nurses (ALIGN) Program.* This grant program is aimed at upskilling lower-level professionals, expanding nursing apprenticeships, increasing nurse educator recruitment and retention, expanding clinical rotations, increasing nursing program capacity where relevant, reimbursing tuition, purchasing equipment, implementing simulation centers, and expanding labs. Each institution is required to provide a healthcare partner contribution, with a two-to-one match by the state for every dollar contributed.

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FUNDING: The approved budget which is incorporated into this MOU shows all eligible expenses for reimbursement by OSD. OSD will reimburse UAFS on a monthly basis for expenses corresponding to the budget categories. Invoicing for reimbursement should be submitted by the 15th of each month for the preceding month's expenses.

Invoices and supporting documents shall be submitted to OSD, Bonnie Casey at bonnie.b.casey@arkansas.gov.

PROGRAM REPORTING:

UAFS will provide reports to OSD at the end of each semester (including summer sessions), or as reasonably requested by OSD. These reports shall contain:

- Healthcare Partner Contribution
- Total expenditures including equipment, salaries, and tuition reimbursement
- Number of students enrolled in each program (LPN, RN, BSN)
- Number of students attaining degree each semester
- Student Wages during training
- Employment Outcomes and Wages at the end of training

ASSURANCES AND COMPLIANCE: This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of Arkansas. The parties agree to comply with Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Executive Order 11246, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and the related regulations to each. Each Party assures that it will not discriminate against any individual on the basis of race, religion, creed, color, sex, age, disability, veteran status, or national origin. Nothing in this MOU may be construed to waive the sovereign or statutory immunities of either Party.

PERIOD COVERED: This MOU shall take effect on August 1, 2024, or the date signed by both Parties. The MOU shall continue through September 30, 2026.

PARTIES: Parties to this MOU are the Arkansas Office of Skills Development (OSD) and Western Arkansas Technical Center (WATC). OSD is a state agency authorized to award strategic grants to public and private organizations for the development and implementation of Arkansas workforce training programs. WATC serve to advance nursing profession by preparing graduates to meet ever-changing client needs for health care.

BACKGROUND: The State of Arkansas has recognized the challenge that the healthcare industry faces due to the nursing shortage that exists across the United States. OSD and Arkansas institutions of higher education have been empowered to design, develop, and implement innovative programs to fill this ever-increasing gap through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 for the *Arkansas Linking Industry to Grow Nurses (ALIGN) Program.* This grant program is aimed at upskilling lower-level professionals, expanding nursing apprenticeships, increasing nurse educator recruitment and retention, expanding clinical rotations, increasing nursing program capacity where relevant, reimbursing tuition, purchasing equipment, implementing simulation centers, and expanding labs.

PURPOSE OF MOU: To provide funding through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 for the *ALIGN Program* at WATC, which will deliver a program of study in Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN). WATC is a multi-district vocational center located on the University of Arkansas Fort Smith and PEAK Innovation Center campuses in Fort Smith. This MOU addresses the budget deficit between the vocational center aid, based on LPN program enrollment, allocated to WATC for state fiscal years 2025 and 2026 and the fixed costs of offering the LPN program during that period.

FUNDING: The funding available under this MOU shall not exceed \$470,589.26. This funding shall be reduced by the vocational center aid awarded for state fiscal years 2025 and 2026. The resulting amount

shall cover actual expenditures incurred by WATC during state fiscal years 2025 and 2026. The funding deficit covered by this MOU involves expenditures for instructor salaries, classroom equipment and textbooks, student supplies, and other fees necessitated by the LPN program offered through WATC.

Itemized descriptions of covered expenses are detailed in the document titled "WATC Approved Budget for ALIGN Funding," which is attached to and incorporated with this MOU.

OSD will reimburse WATC upon receipt of documentation, expenses consistent with the "WATC Approved Budget for ALIGN Funding" that have been incurred.

Invoices and supporting documents shall be submitted to OSD, Lesia Edwards at lesia.edwards@arkansas.gov.

WATC will provide reports to OSD as requested. These reports shall contain:

- Verified enrollment data
- Certifications/credentials earned

- Employment outcomes

Dear Colleague,

On March 28, 2025, the Department of Education (the Department) <u>issued a letter</u> to State Education Chiefs rescinding its prior extensions of the liquidation period for COVID-related grants awarded under the Education Stabilization Fund (ESF) program. On April 3, the Department followed up with <u>an additional letter</u> outlining the process for requesting extensions for specific projects.

On May 6, the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York entered a preliminary injunction in *New York et al. v. Department of Education et al.*, 1:25-cv-02990-ER, enjoining the Department from "enforcing or implementing as against Plaintiffs" the March 28 revocation of the extension period for 16 plaintiff states and the District of Columbia.

On May 11, the Department <u>issued a letter</u> notifying the plaintiffs in the *New York* litigation that the Department was modifying the period to liquidate obligations under the ESF program to terminate on May 25.

On June 3, the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York entered another preliminary injunction in the *New York* litigation that enjoined the Department from "enforcing or implementing as against Plaintiffs" the directives in the May 11 letter.

Recently, on June 20, the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit denied the Department's motion to stay the District Court's June 3, 2025 injunction.¹

The original intent of the policy announced on March 28 was to treat all states consistently with regards to safeguarding and refocusing their remaining COVID-era grant funding on students. The ongoing litigation has created basic fairness and uniformity problems—many states, such as yours, have continued to be covered by the March 28 policy, while the plaintiffs in the *New York* litigation have not been subject to that policy due to events in the litigation.²

As such, given the uniformity and fairness problems set forth above, during the pendency of this litigation and unless and until the Department is allowed to uniformly apply the policy described in the March 28 letter to all states, the Department has decided to address these fairness and uniformity problems in this interim period by returning non-plaintiff states to the liquidation process in place prior to the issuance of the March 28 letter. Thus, as of today, all states can

submit reimbursement or route pay requests (depending on the specific state) for their ESF programs, and they will be reviewed and evaluated consistent with that prior process. States that have already submitted requests and receipts as part of the review and appeals process do not need to resubmit — see our FAQ for more details.

Note that in the *New York* litigation, the Department opposed the entry of injunctions on the grounds that, among other reasons, the Department is unlikely to be able to recover funds even if the Department ultimately prevails in the litigation. To mitigate those concerns, and consistent with the prior process, we will carefully review requests in order to ensure they continue to adhere to governmentwide grant cost principles and that, broadly, expenditures are intended to "prepare, prevent, and respond to coronavirus."

There are some specific circumstances, including the disposition of pending prior project-specific requests and pending administrative appeals, addressed in a new set of <u>FAQs available</u> here.

Thank you for your attention to this matter, and for all you are doing to support our Nation's students.

American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 Water Related Projects, Wastewater and Stormwater Projects, Irrigation Projects

Summary:

The Department received \$280,000,000 in ARPA funding in 2022, which was awarded to two Irrigation projects totaling \$10,000,000, 105 Water projects totaling \$134,673,713.00 and 52 wastewater and stormwater related projects totaling \$135,326,287.00.

As of 7/24/25, 64 projects totaling \$96,949,544.75 have fully disbursed the approved ARPA funding, 88 projects totaling \$173,050,455.25 are under construction or plan to start construction soon. This appropriation modification request will allow the Department to reallocate any returned funds to other projects regardless if it is water or wastewater and stormwater related project.
