Title: Detection & Mitigation of COVID-19 in Confinement Facilities

Executive Summary:

The Arkansas Department of Health (ADH) has received federal funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), in collaboration with the Department of Justice, through the Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity (ELC) Cooperative Agreement to support detection and mitigation of COVID-19 in confinement facilities. Specifically, the funding is intended to provide testing and infection control resources to our State's prisons and jails to identify cases rapidly and mitigate the spread of COVID-19 within these settings.

The ADH plans to utilize funds to directly support prisons and jails in the following ways: 1) provide funding directly to the Arkansas Department of Corrections through a memorandum of agreement (MOA) to support a variety of response activities (outlined below) based on the need of each individual facility; 2) solicit a subgrant for funds to be dispersed to city and county jails to support a variety of response activities (outlined below) based on the need of each individual facility; 3) purchase laboratory supplies for COVID-19 testing at the Arkansas State Public Health Laboratory; 4) purchase point of care testing materials to be distributed to prisons and jails; 5) solicit a professional services agreement to provide strike teams for collection and delivery of samples to the SPHL for testing; and 6) a small, dedicated staff to COVID-19 mitigation in confined settings at the Arkansas Department of Health.

These funds are to be used for a variety of response activities, determined by need, to detect and mitigate the COVID-19 pandemic. The ADH is required to ensure that funds are utilized to conduct the single required activity and can choose among optional activities to support response activities. ADH will guide prisons and jails on ensuring that funds are utilized within these parameters. Funds cannot be used to provide clinical services, general staffing, or purchase, storage, or administer vaccines. Allowable activities are as follows:

a. Required Activity:

1. Establish and implement diagnostic and screening testing programs for detainees/inmates, staff, and visitors. *Note: Laboratory diagnostic funds are available to be spent at the State Public Health Laboratory.

b. Optional Activities:

1. Conduct COVID-19 testing and contact tracing.
2. Implement recommended isolation and quarantine strategies including for confirmed and suspected cases and close contacts.
3. Implement distancing policies and training staff on maintaining distancing practices.
4. Develop staffing strategies that reduce the risk of virus transmission (e.g. organize staff assignments so that the same staff are assigned to the same areas of the facility over time).
5. Implement policies and practices that support transportation that are consistent with recommendations to reduce transmission.
6. Implement visitor policies consistent with recommendations to reduce virus risk.
7. Implement infection control practices inside facilities.

8. Develop and implement procedures and systems to improve confinement facility preparedness and response efforts.
9. Coordinate preparedness and response efforts with state, local, tribal, and territorial public health departments to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19 within confinement facilities.
10. Enhance and/or improve the practices of confinement facilities to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, and to reduce the risk of virus transmission and exposure to environmental health hazards.
11. Purchase of additional supplies to sanitize and clean the confinement facilities. Funding must not supplant existing expenditures on such supplies and can only be used to support enhanced cleaning efforts.
12. Educate and train confinement facility staff and residents/detainees/inmates on sanitation and minimizing the spread of Infectious diseases.
13. Implement COVID-19 mitigation practices to minimize potential opportunities for exposure including video conferencing technology and other measures for attorney/client purposes, court appearances, family visiting, and programming.
