With this letter, TSS OSP is presenting all such contracts that it has received for legislative review this month. The Arkansas Department of Veteran's Affairs is presenting two contracts for ratification; number 4600054141, because they have outstanding invoices that exceed the approved amount and number 4600041822 because of payments made to the contractor after the contract expired. The Arkansas Department of Public Safety is presenting two contracts, numbers 4600055793 and 4600055794, for ratification. Both contracts expired on 05/19/2024 but the contractor continued working past that date. The Arkansas Crime Information Center is presenting purchase order 4502251443 because the contractor began work prior to legislative review of the contract.

Arkansas Procurement Law allows a contract that has been awarded in violation of it to be ratified and affirmed if "the person awarded the contract has not acted fraudulently or in bad faith" and it is "determined that doing so is in the best interests of the state." Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-247(c)(1)(A). Alternatively, it may be terminated. See Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-247(c)(1)(B).

However, whenever a contract that is subject to the review requirements of Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-265 is presented for ratification, it must first be presented to the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, to the Joint Budget Committee, for review. See Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-247(d). Accordingly, the above-mentioned contracts are now being presented for your review prior to a determination of whether it should be ratified and affirmed or terminated.

ACIC and OSP worked together to issue a Request for Proposal (MAP) in June of 2021 for a new Sex Offender Registry Database. Mainstream Technologies was awarded contract 4600049728 as a result of this solicitation. ACIC worked with Mainstream over the past few years to build a new Sex Offender Registry. After go live of the new registry, ACIC became aware of some updates that would greatly enhance the existing system. The agency was awarded SORNA Federal Grant funds to help fund these updates and those funds are set to expire January 31, 2025. Due to the time constraints of funding, and the complexity of the system, finding a vendor other than the creator of the registry to accomplish these updates would not be feasible.

Identify the reason a competitive procurement is contrary to public interest.

Mainstream Technologies designed and implemented the current system and has first hand knowledge of the registry. They are also under contract for maintance and support for the Arkansas Criminal History Database which interacts with the SOR Database/System. That contract began with Request for Proposal SP-20-0111 also being awarded to Mainstream.

Identify the expected duration of the unusual or unique situation.

With the knowledge Mainstream has of the system it is more cost, as well as time, effective for them to complete this upgrade. With this being partially funded by the SORNA grant, Mainstream's prior knowledge makes them the only vendor that could complete the update prior to the grant expiration date.

Dear Mr. Long,

Thank you for your December 27, 2024, correspondence requesting authority for the Department of Public Safety's (DPS) Arkansas Crime Information Center (ACIC) to initiate a special procurement with Mainstream Technologies without competitive bidding, competitive sealed bidding, or competitive sealed proposals. DPS contends that unusual or unique circumstance would make applying those requirements contrary to the public interest, and I agree.

Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-263 provides that the State Procurement Director may initiate a special procurement when it has been determined that an "unusual or unique situation exists that makes the application of all requirements of competitive bidding, competitive sealed bidding, or competitive sealed proposals contrary to the public interest."

ACIC seeks a special procurement to engage Mainstream Technologies for critical enhancements and updates to the Sex Offender Registry Database. In 2021, ACIC awarded Mainstream Technologies contract 4600049728 to develop and implement this system. Following its launch, key updates were identified to significantly improve they system's functionality.

ACIC has secured Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA) federal grant funds to partially finance these enhancements, but those funds expire on January 31, 2025. Due to the system's complexity and the pending deadline, engaging any vendor other than Mainstream Technologies is not feasible. Mainstream possesses first-hand knowledge of the system's architecture, having designed and implemented it, and is also under contract for maintenance and support of the interconnected Arkansas Criminal History Database. A competitive procurement would require a new vendor to invest significant time and resources to understand the system, jeopardizing timely

implementation and efficient use of the grant funds. Mainstream Technologies' existing expertise and proven track record with ACIC, through prior OSP procurements for both the Sex Offender Registry and Criminal History Databases, make them uniquely qualified to implement these updates efficiently. This special procurement ensures the effective use of limited federal funds, maximizing benefits to the State of Arkansas.

Given the unique circumstances described above, a special procurement is warranted for ACIC to complete this project. In reliance on the information provided by ACIC, I find that the standard for a special procurement as set forth in Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-263 is met and that the selection of Mainstream Technologies is appropriate. Therefore, ACIC's request for special procurement with Mainstream Technologies to update and enhance the capabilities of the existing Sex Offender Registry Database for a total projected cost of \$134,075.00 is approved.
