Project Title: FY24 Arkansas Nursery and Tree Orchard Enhancement Project

Bipartisan Infrastructure Legislation: SEC. 40804(9)(B) – Bipartisan Infrastructure Assistance to Enhance State Nurseries and Seed Orchards

Description: The purpose of this project is to support modernization efforts at the Arkansas Department of Agriculture's Forestry Division's (formerly known as the Arkansas Forestry Commission), Baucum Nursery by purchasing one new seedling lifter with pickup attachment, make repairs and upgrades to storage coolers, purchasing bar code hardware, restoring 30.5 acres to production, purchasing a metal 40 feet X 80 feet equipment canopy, replacing the greenhouse climate controller, purchasing a four-wheel drive crew cab pickup, and purchasing a gas powered arc welder. Reliable equipment and increased seedling production will improve overall nursery operational efficiencies and output. Expanding the nursery production area will increase seedling production.

Scope of Work:

The Arkansas Department of Agriculture's Forestry Division's Baucum Nursery grows and sells hardwood and pine seedlings for reforestation, specializing in native Arkansas trees, and a variety of genetically improved species. The nursery covers about 220 acres and has been operating since the 1950s.

Nursery operations require labor intensive activities. Unfortunately, workforce turnover continues to cause limitations on seedling production. Improvements of operational efficiency and mechanization will help reduce the limiting factor of personnel shortages and increase nursery capacity. Restoring a 30.5 acres overgrown area into production will increase the number of seedlings produced annually.

Current Reallocation Request:

The Arkansas Department of Public Safety – Arkansas Division of Emergency Management is requesting to reallocate \$108,000 from Regular Salaries, Personal Services Matching, Professional Fees and Operating Expenses to Conference and Travel Expenses and Capital Outlay for program training needs and a training vehicle needed through the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Grant.

Original Request:

The Arkansas Department of Public Safety – Arkansas Division of Emergency Management requested Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act appropriation in the amount of \$275,367 for the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Grant. This is the 3rd year award of the 3 year HMEP program and includes the continuation of year 2 award funds.

Background:

The HMEP grant program was established in 1990 by the Hazardous Materials Transportation Uniform Safety Act. In 1993, PHMSA began issuing grants to assist States, Territories, and Native American Tribes to "develop, improve, and carry out emergency plans" within the National Response System and the Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act of 1986. The HMEP grant program is designed to allow grantees the flexibility to implement training and planning programs that address differing needs for each location based on demographics, emergency response capabilities, commodity flow studies, and hazard analysis. Relevant trainings are found in the *National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 472: Standard for Competence of Responders to Hazardous Materials/Weapons of Mass Destruction Incidents* publication and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations found in 29 CFR § 1910.120.

Governors in each State, or their counterparts within Territories or Tribes, designate an agency to receive the HMEP grant funds. Agencies submit grant applications to PHMSA annually requesting funds for proposed activities. PHMSA reviews and evaluates applications to make certain the proposed activities support the program mission to ensure the safe transportation of hazmat. If approved, PHMSA offers the agency a Notice of Grant Award (NGA) for acceptance and signature. Once executed, the agency may distribute grant funds in accordance with the planned activities identified in the grant application within the State, Territory, or Tribe to Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs) and first responder organizations.

Purpose/Goal:

ADEM's purpose is to protect against the risks to life, property, and the environment that are inherent to the transportation of hazardous materials in intrastate, interstate, and foreign commerce. Through the HMEP program ADEM designs, develops, and delivers comprehensive preparedness and response training to public sector employees. ADEM will also maintain staff to manage this training effort.
