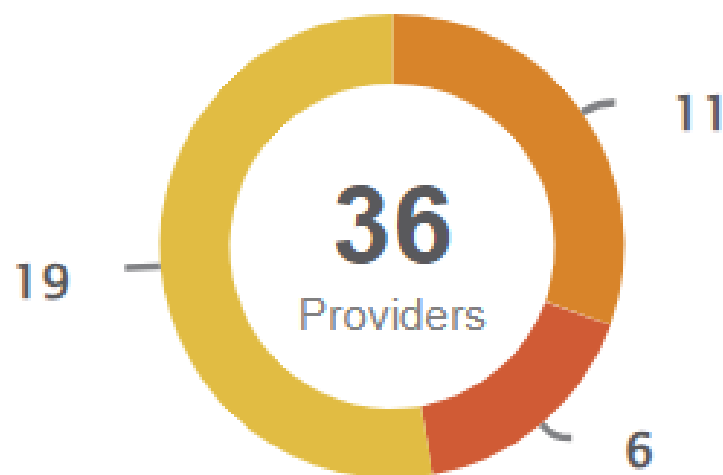

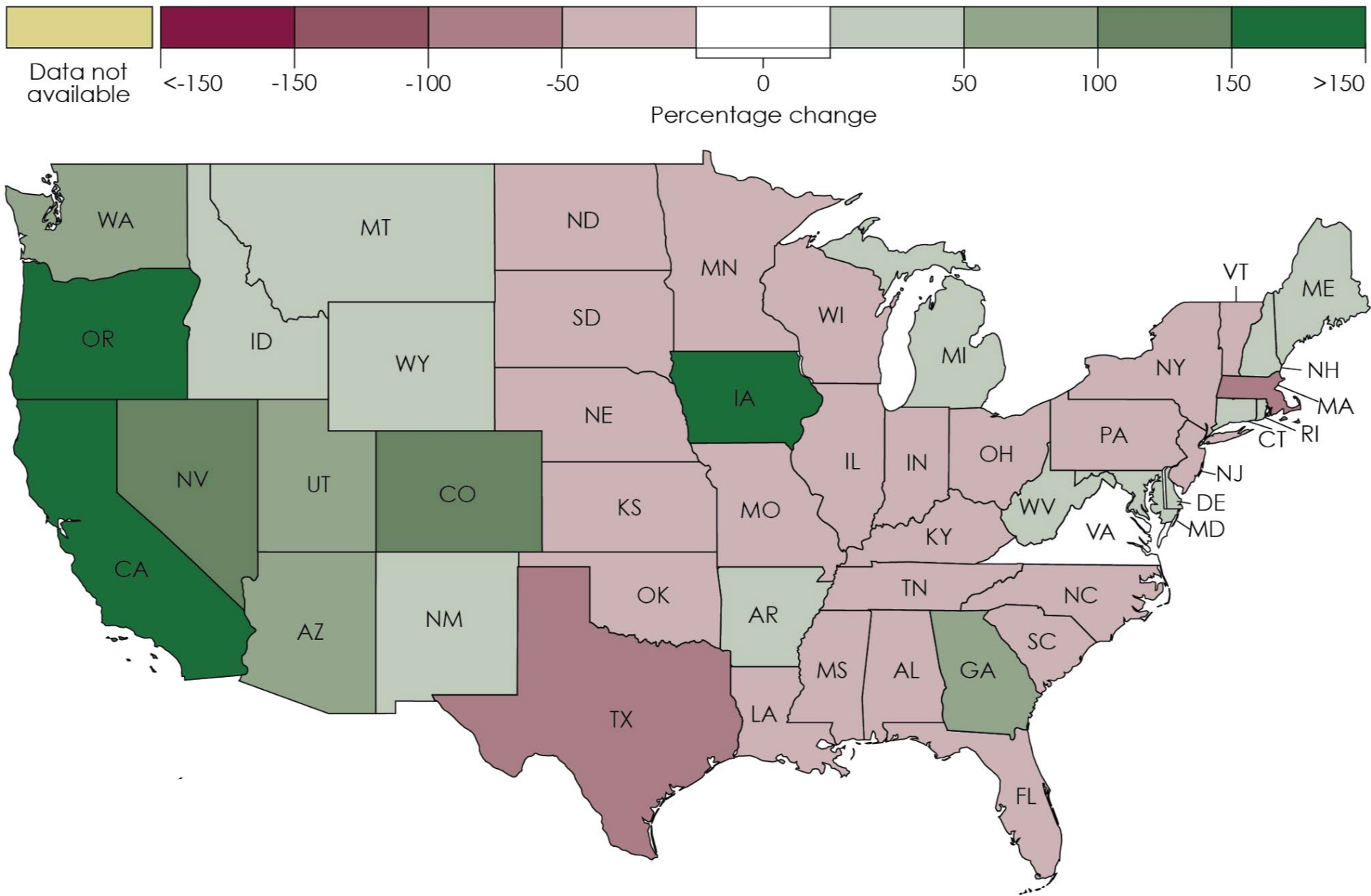

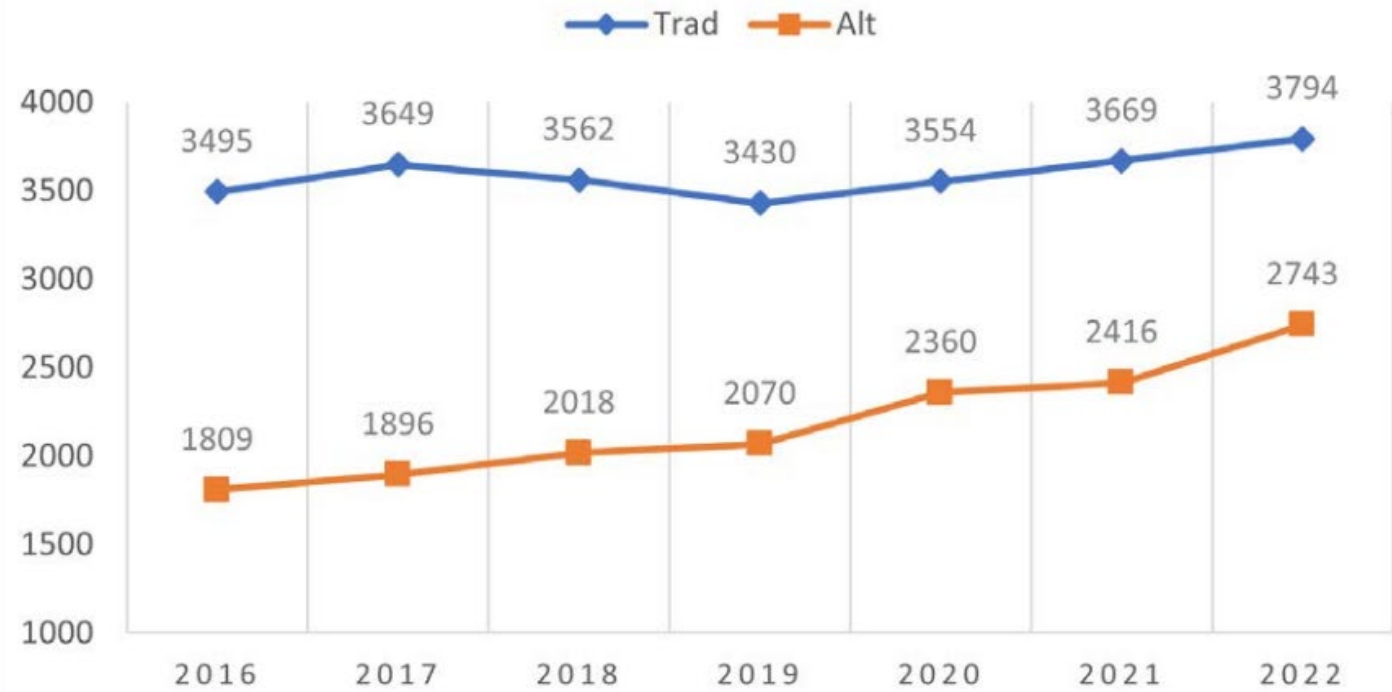

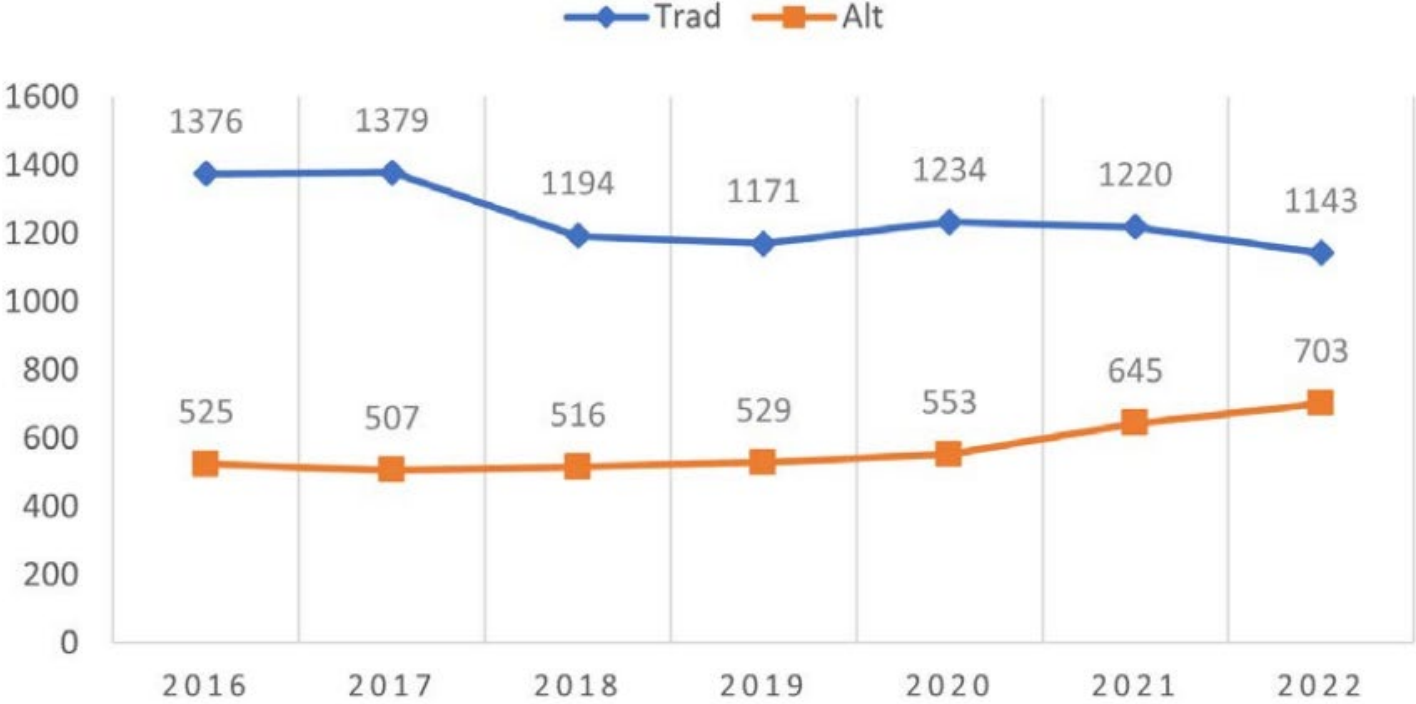
FIGURE 2.6. PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE NUMBER OF TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAMS, BY STATE OR JURISDICTION: 2012–13 TO 2018–19



EPP ENROLLMENT BY ROUTE

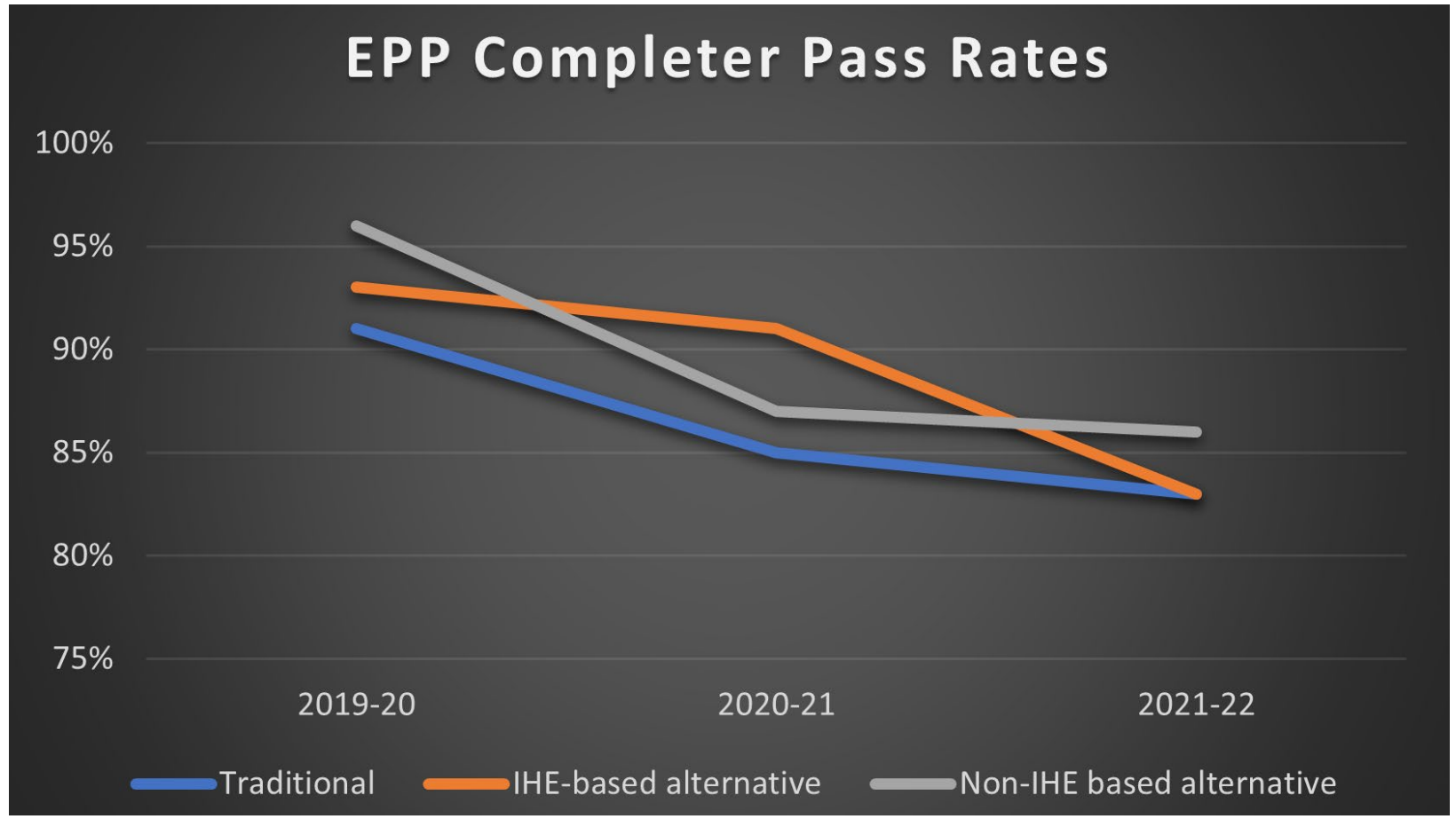


EPP COMPLETERS BY ROUTE



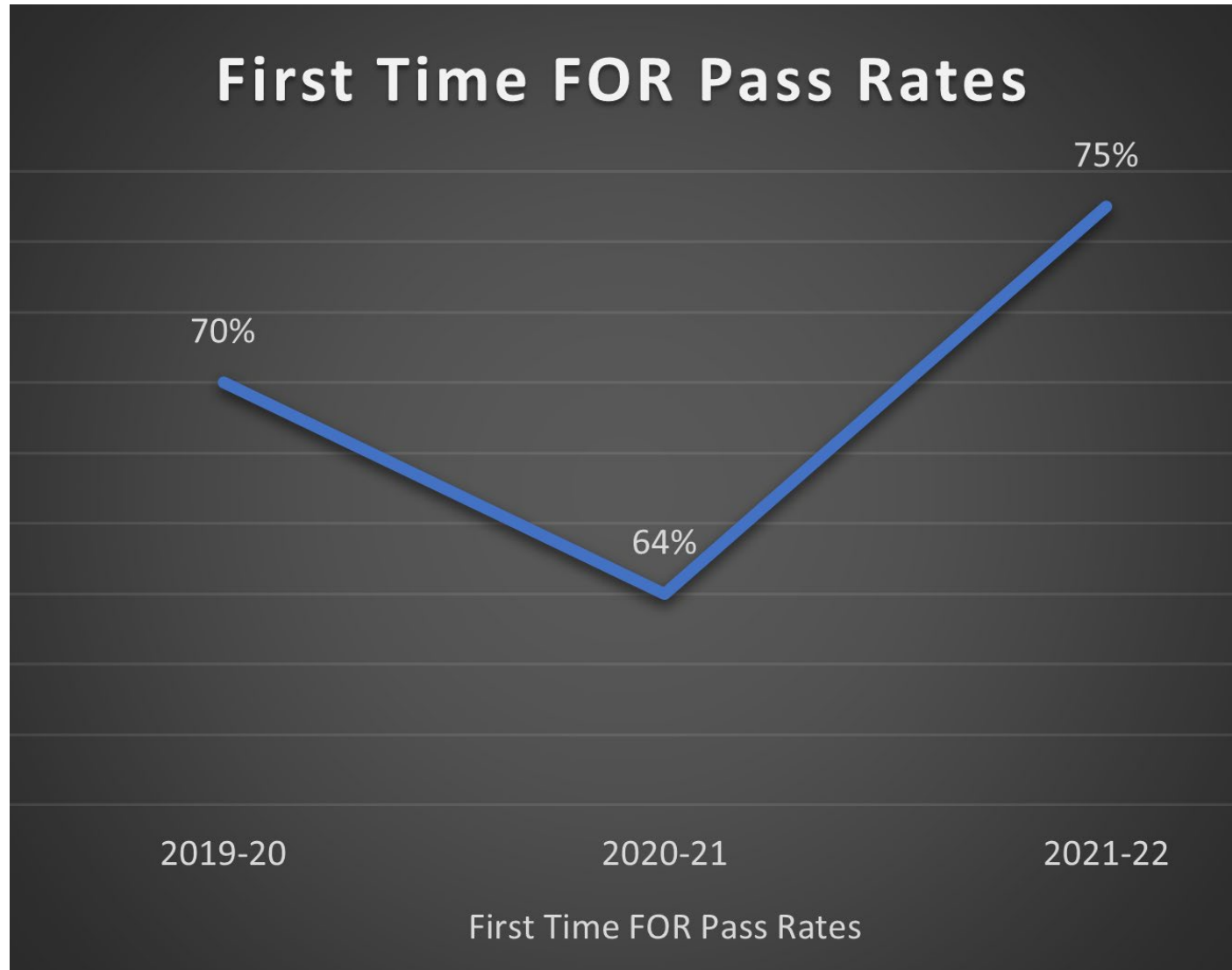


Candidates who do not receive a passing score have the opportunity to demonstrate content competency in other ways, such as completing a performance-based assessment.

What is the Arkansas Teacher Registered Apprenticeship?

A Registered Apprenticeship is a proven model of professional training that has been validated by the United States Department of Labor (USDOL). Registering the program through the USDOL, the K-12 Teacher Apprenticeship model meets national quality standards that are established by both employers and job seekers.

Qualifications:

Enrolled in college coursework leading to a degree in education
Preferential treatment for current Certified Teaching Assistants (CTA)

Step in Residency Model:

The registered apprenticeship is a pathway within the Arkansas Teacher Residency Model. It is not a path that will be appropriate for all, but one path that assists in leading teachers to a professional license.

A registered apprentice will be:

Employed by a School District | Enrolled in a program leading to licensure
Apprentice in the Arkansas Teacher Registered Apprenticeship
