#### **Summary and Basis for Rule Promulgation**

Pursuant to Act 841 of 2023, the Arkansas State Fire Marshal within the Office of Fire Protection Services shall adopt rules for the administration of the Arkansas Comprehensive Fire Protection Act of 1993. The State Fire Marshal shall adopt rules for the keeping, storing, using, manufacture, selling, handling, transportation, or other disposition of highly inflammable materials and rubbish, gunpowder, dynamite, crude petroleum or any of its products, explosives or compounds, or any other explosive, including fireworks, and firecrackers, and he or she may prescribe the materials and construction of receptacles and buildings to be used for any of those purposes. The rules initially promulgated by the Division of Arkansas State Police regarding fire enforcement, the Fire Prevention Act, § 12-13-101 et seq. or the Arkansas Fire Code remain in effect until adopted by the State Fire Marshal as rules of the Office of Fire Protection Services.

The rules are set out in detail in the copy attached hereto. These Rules become effective ten days after the date of final filing with the Secretary of State's Office.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that said rules are to become effective January 1, 2023, in compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act of the State of Arkansas (A.C.A. §25-15-201 through §25-15-214) and shall be known as the *Arkansas Fire Prevention Code*. 2021 edition.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State Fire Marshal by Act 841 of 2023 (§20-22-1010), these rules are promulgated as originally adopted by the Director of the Division of Arkansas State Police pursuant to by Section 6 of Act 254 of 1.955 (A.C.A. §12-13-105). These Rules are promulgated by the Director of the Division of Arkansas State Police, who serves by operation of law as the Arkansas State Fire Marshal under the authority granted by Arkansas Act 254 of 1995, codified at A.C.A. §12-13-101 to A.C.A. §12-13-116, as amended. The purpose of these Rules is to aid in the implementation, interpretation and enforcement of the *Arkansas Fire Prevention Code* (AFPC), 2021 edition.

The *International Fire Code*, 2021 edition, the *International Building Code*, 2021 edition, and the *International Residential Code*, 2021 edition, as published by the International Code Council and the rules, as amended and adopted by the Arkansas State Fire Marshal, shall constitute the *Arkansas Fire Prevention Code*, 2021 edition. These Rules become effective ten days after the date of final filing with the Secretary of State's Office. These Rules shall be effective January 1, 2023.

The following shall be defined as:

INTERNATIONAL PLUMBING CODE shall mean the Arkansas State Plumbing Code.

INTERNATIONAL PRIVATE SEWAGE DISPOSAL CODE is replaced by "Arkansas Department of Health Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Onsite Wastewater Systems."

INTERNATIONAL MECHANICAL CODE shall mean the mechanical code for Arkansas.

INTERNATIONAL FUEL GAS CODE shall mean the Arkansas State Gas Code.

INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE shall mean the Arkansas Energy Code.

INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE shall mean the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code, Volume I.

INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE shall mean the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code, Volume II.

INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE shall mean the *Arkansas Fire Prevention Code*, Volume II.

NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE shall mean the electrical code for the State of Arkansas.

BUILDING OFFICIAL shall mean any governmental official having authority to enforce that aspect of the code.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State Fire Marshal by Act 841 of 2023 (§20-22-1010), these rules are promulgated as originally adopted by the Director of the Division of Arkansas State Police pursuant to by Section 6 of Act 254 of 1.955 (A.C.A. §12-13-105). These Rules are promulgated by the Director of the Division of Arkansas State Police, who serves by operation of law as the Arkansas State Fire Marshal under the authority granted by Arkansas Act 254 of 1995, codified at A.C.A. §12-13-101 to A.C.A. §12-13-116, as amended. The purpose of these Rules is to aid in the implementation, interpretation and enforcement of the *Arkansas Fire Prevention Code* (AFPC), 2021 edition.

The *International Fire Code*, 2021 edition, the *International Building Code*, 2021 edition, and the *International Residential Code*, 2021 edition, as published by the International Code Council and the rules, as amended and adopted by the Arkansas State Fire Marshal, shall constitute the *Arkansas Fire Prevention Code*, 2021 edition. These Rules become effective ten days after the date of final filing with the Secretary of State's Office. These Rules shall be effective January 1, 2023.

The following shall be defined as:

INTERNATIONAL PLUMBING CODE shall mean the Arkansas State Plumbing Code.

INTERNATIONAL PRIVATE SEWAGE DISPOSAL CODE is replaced by "Arkansas Department of Health Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Onsite Wastewater Systems."

INTERNATIONAL MECHANICAL CODE shall mean the mechanical code for Arkansas.

INTERNATIONAL FUEL GAS CODE shall mean the Arkansas State Gas Code.

INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE shall mean the Arkansas Energy Code.

INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE shall mean the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code, Volume I.

INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE shall mean the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code, Volume II.

INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE shall mean the *Arkansas Fire Prevention Code*, Volume II.

NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE shall mean the electrical code for the State of Arkansas.
