1919, as amended, may secure a dealer's certificate by filing with the Board an affidavit stating that they will keep the Director informed of the names and addresses of the nurserymen from whom they secured nursery stock and that they will not ship under the dealer's certificate any nursery stock unless the grower of said nursery stock is in possession of a valid certificate or permit issued by the Board.
