ALC – Occupational Licensing Review Subcommittee Occupational Entity Questionnaire

Responses to the following questions are due via email to Subcommittee staff no later than the 15th of the month immediately preceding the month the occupational authorization is scheduled for review by the Subcommittee.

1. Would consumers be at risk of substantial harm if Arkansas did not have this occupational authorization? What instances of specific and substantial harm have been documented in the past year? **There have been complaints about unlicensed activity. They have taken off with money owed to the customer, advertised something to be sold and end up not being what was advertised or not having the item at all.**
2. How many complaints were made to the occupational entity by consumers being harmed by unauthorized practitioners? What specific action was taken by the occupational entity? **7 complaints since 2025 regarding unlicensed activity. Our law limits what we can do in these situations. We can fine them up to \$500 and that is what we do with a consent agreement advising them to get licensed.**
3. How many complaints were made to the occupational entity by consumers being harmed by authorized practitioners? What specific action was taken by the occupational entity? **6 complaints regarding those licensed, those were all dismissed.**
4. Were any applicants who otherwise met authorization requirements denied an authorization in the past year? If so, why? **No one has been denied a license.**
5. How much does the occupational entity collect annually in fees, and what are annual expenses? How much money does the occupational entity have in reserves? **We take in approximately 110,000 and have about \$60,000 in reserves.**
6. If the occupational entity has a positive amount in reserves, when was the last time reserve funds were used? For what purpose? **To my knowledge we haven't used reserved funds.**
7. Does the occupational entity have any other sources of revenue? Could occupational authorization fees be reduced without causing the occupational entity to be underfunded? **No, we have no other sources of revenue. We would be underfunded.**
8. How many applicants for the occupational authorization fail each year? Does the occupational entity track how many applicants that do not progress are veterans, women,

or minorities? We have about 4-5 that fail each year. They are allowed to continue testing for a year, if it is not passed, we can ask for another year's extension, but if it is not passed in that second year, they must start the process over. We do not track that information.

9. Can applicants complete the training requirements for this occupational authorization with vocational or non-traditional education (e.g., apprenticeships)? What percentage of applicants complete apprenticeships? We have no education or training requirements prior to applying.
10. In what ways would removal of the occupational authorization or reduction of occupational authorization requirements be harmful to current authorization holders? We already have an issue with unlicensed activity that hurts those that do have a license. Those licensed could lose value, reducing their professionalism and reputation.
