Report Name ACC Supervision Population - Caseloads/Workloads

Description This report contains statewide caseload information for ACC. Caseloads are presented separately for Regular P&P, Specialty Court, and Specialized Caseloads. This version is specifically designed for quarterly legislative reporting and differs from the daily caseloads/workloads report. Beyond the exclusion of workloads calculation, it is important to note that Direct Supervision here includes Regular P&P and Specialty Court (including regular P&P offenders carried by Specialty Court officers) offenders with Active (Direct), Electronic Monitoring, or Incarceration Supervision Status, as well as Absconders assigned to SRT officers. Offenders on annual supervision are counted as Indirect. **IMPORTANT:** Because page level filters and the totals displayed on the first page span multiple pages, these calculations must be performed Ad Hoc (i.e., in Excel). To do this, export the report to Excel format, and total the cells corresponding to each of the first two total cell formats. The third total is the sum of the first two totals.

1. The central unit of analysis here is the officer, not the offender, which means that classifications such as 'Regular P&P' and 'Specialty Court' are determined by the location of the officer according to the official State personnel system, AASIS.

2. Workloads are calculated as follows:

3. Caseloads are presented in three distinct officer groupings:

- Regular These are officers carrying normal Probation and Parole caseloads.

- Specialty Court These officers supervise offenders in specialty courts. Note that these officers may also carry regular P&P offenders, and these offenders are reflected in the specialty court caseload/workload figures; however, separate caseload/workload ratios are calculated for the regular and specialty court portions of a specialty court officer's caseload, in addition to a combined, or mixed, ratio.

Notes - Specialized These officers supervise strategically specialized caseloads consisting of offenders requiring heightened supervision protocols (Intensive Supervision) and parolees who have absconded supervision (Supervision Response Team).

- Indirect These are offenders for whom their sentence, circumstance, or current status is associated with a reduced supervision obligation for the officers they are assigned to. Generally, these include offenders in Non-Reporting status, those on Suspended Sentences (SIS), and Interstate Compact offenders. Offenders on Annual Supervision are also included in this group.

4. Regular and Specialty Court caseload calculations included only offenders with Active (Direct), Electronic Monitoring, and Incarcerated supervision statuses, and further excludes those offenders whose risk classification has placed them on Annual Supervision.

5. Slight variations in operational definition are used throughout the tables that follow. Please pay close attention to the footnotes that accompany each table to ensure appropriate interpretation of the figures reported therein.
