GLOSSARY

ACHM – Asphalt Concrete Hot Mix

Bridge and Approaches - Constructing bridge structures and sections leading up to the bridge

Calendar day contract – Contract where the number of calendar days are bid

CAP – Connecting Arkansas Program

CPM -- Critical Path Method—A step-by-step project management technique that identifies critical activities that must be completed before the next stage can proceed.

(F) – Project with Federal Oversight

Grading and Structures - Earthwork and bridge construction; "structures" includes bridges and drainage structures

Interchange – Improvements to the junction between two or more roadways, typically including an overpass or bridge with associated ramps

IRP – Interstate Rehabilitation Program

Major Widening – Widening of an existing roadway to improve capacity or enhance safety, generally by adding a lane or lanes

New Location – Construction of a roadway on a location not previously developed for vehicular transportation

PCC Pavement – Portland Cement Concrete Pavement

Reconstruction – Generally, removing an existing roadway and building a new road in the same place

Rehabilitation – Modifying or improving an existing roadway; generally less costly and less time consuming than a full reconstruction

Resurfacing – Installation or application of a new driving surface; could be an overlay, sealing job, or similar procedure

ROW – Right of Way

(S) – Project with State Oversight

Safety and Traffic Engineering – Various improvements to enhance safety and/or improve traffic flow

Working Day Contract – Contract for which time will be assessed for each day on which conditions allow the Contractor to work per Standard Specification for Highway Construction

The contractor has completed placement of high-density polyurethane foam beneath concrete panels to remediate poor soils and/or get the displaced panels back to the proper grade. Patching of Portland Cement concrete pavement panels has also been completed. Work to complete sawing and sealing of joints is underway, as is work to complete diamond grinding of the pavement.

Change orders have been processed amounting to approximately \$606,000 related to 1) additional locations for leveling and undersealing of concrete panels and 2) additional removal, disposal, and replacement of severely cracked panels.



The purpose of this project is to rehabilitate 10.75 miles of I-30 between Rockport and Hwy. 70, Hot Spring and Saline Counties.

Retrofitting dowel bars, injection of high density polyurethane foam (HDPF) for slab leveling, and grinding of concrete pavement is ongoing eastbound and westbound.

The overall project cost has increased by \$9.7 million due to additional quantity of HDPF to level the slabs and additional concrete patching required. 193 calendar days were added to the project to accomplish this additional work.

The purpose of this project is to widen 5.9 miles of I-30 from four lanes to six lanes west of Benton in Saline County.

Increased project cost of approximately \$33.8 million is due to the need for additional quantities of traffic control devices, curb and gutter, drop inlets and pipe culverts, resurfacing/patching of the existing roadway, the need to remove and replace unsuitable soil at various locations including beneath a retaining wall, additional backfill for the mechanically stabilized earth wall, increases to project overhead items due to time added to the contract, including the time added by Memorandum of Understanding.

On February 8, 2024 the Chief Engineer for Operations advised the contractor that we would recommend default to the Highway Commission due to lack of progress. After presentations by the Department at the February 13, 2024 Highway Commission meeting, the Commission voted to delay the recommendation to default to allow the contractor's executive leadership to meet with the Department's administration and attempt to develop a plan and schedule for completion of the work. Since that time, the Department and contractor's management have held weekly meetings, the contractor has moved a full time dedicated project manager to the project, and has mobilized additional forces and equipment to the project. Based on a presentation and recommendation by the Chief Engineer for Operations at the April 4th Highway Commission meeting and observation of the work being completed, the Commission voted to defer further action on the proposed default until the next Highway Commission meeting in June 2024 or at a special meeting if necessary.

At the June 19, 2024 Highway Commission Meeting the Chief Engineer of Operations provided an update on the contractor's progress. They continue to maintain their current progress due to several positive organizational changes. If they continue at this rate it is anticipated they will be complete by the end of 2024.

On May 15, 2023 the contractor filed a claim against the Department appealing the Chief Engineer's decision to deny addition time for various claimed impacts. A settlement agreement was reached on May 24, 2024 between the Department and the contractor wherein it was agreed the Department would continue to assess Road User Charges

but would delay the withholding so that positive pay estimates may be processed to generate cash flow for the contractor to be able to pay their suppliers and subcontractors. As part of the claim, the contractor had submitted new information relating to previously denied time extension requests for various issues during the course of the project. Following a review of the information submitted, a Memorandum of Understanding was reached on July 29, 2024 which resulted in the addition of 444 calendar days for 9 previously denied time extension requests and the payment of \$30.7 million dollars for project overhead costs incurred during the 444 days. On September 6, 2024 the contractor filed a Motion for Voluntary Dismissal of the claim.

Current activities include final construction of the Hwy 70 interchange ramps and construction of concrete barrier wall. The signals at Hwy 67 were activated on August 8, 2024 and have performed well. Traffic was also switched into Stage 5 on September 18, 2024 which placed eastbound and westbound traffic on their respective sides of the median barrier wall. Upcoming scheduled traffic switches include October 14 for Hwy 70 Ramp 3 (WB 30 to Hwy 70), October 18 WB into final configuration (3 lanes open), October 19 Hwy 70 Ramp 4 into final configuration (Hwy 70 to WB 30), October 26 EB into final configuration (3 lanes open), October 28 Hwy 70 Ramp 2 into final configuration (Hwy 70 to EB 30).

All primary structural work is complete on the project is now complete. Current structural work includes miscellaneous items and punch list work.

The James Street Bridge is complete and was opened to traffic October 17, 2024. Vandenberg southbound bridge Mechanically Stabilized Earth (MSE) wall is complete. Work is continuing on the second structure, the southbound Vandenberg Bridge, with the substructure nearing completion. New PPCP southbound main lanes south of the James St Bridge near completion with a main lane traffic schedule scheduled before 2025. An existing pavement evaluation is being performed to proactively extend the existing pavement life in anticipation of the winter months. The project continues to track ahead of schedule on cost verses time (>+17%). The Department is committed to maintain two lanes of traffic to the AFB and continue to make MOT plan revisions to maintain the lanes.

The project cost has increased approximately \$4.9 million due to traffic control devices, drainage structures, temporary retaining wall for staged construction, the addition of wrecker service, select granular backfill for the Mechanically Stabilized Earth (MSE) walls and pavement preservation as noted.



The purpose of this project is to replace three existing bridge structures. Two of the bridge replacements are located on the Saline River: the first on Hwy 70 near Dierks, and the second on Hwy 278 near Umpire. The third bridge structure is located on Hwy 70 in Glenwood and crosses the Caddo River.

The contractor encountered issues with construction of the substructure at the Site 1 Bridge location. The Department and contractor selected an alternate construction method and have agreed on timing and costs. It is anticipated that work on Site 1 will restart in November 2024. Recent bridge work on Site 2 involves completion of bridge deck and parapet wall placement. Construction of approach slabs, sidewalks, curb & gutters, and driveways are ongoing. Site 3 bridge work has been completed; traffic has been routed onto the new bridge, with the old bridge now removed.

Change orders have been approved to modify the method used to widen the existing roadway at Site 2 which has provided a savings to the current contract amount by approximately \$218,000. Other savings (approximately \$91,000) are related to reduced use of anticipated embankment material. The Value Engineering work for Site 1 was rescinded due to unknown site conditions; the bridge's substructure has been redesigned and a change order was approved in August 2024 for an approximately \$4,212,000. Separately, there has been some additional work related to driveway modifications, tie-ins to adjacent highways and highway turnouts, drainage modifications, improvement of existing soils, accessibility modifications, constructability modifications, extra erosion control measures, additional concrete curing requirements, maintenance of traffic (aggregate for driveways, asphalt concrete hot-mix for leveling) operations, and modifications to bridge caps, totaling approximately \$520,000.





The contract amount has been reduced by approximately \$538,000 due to a plan error that doubled the quantities of reinforcing steel and concrete for approach gutters and slabs. 

In the beginning, utility conflicts were encountered affecting the entire project. At this point utility relocations have been completed. Upon resolution of the majority of the conflicts, the Department and contractor agreed to an additional 951 calendar days to be awarded on June 19, 2023. Since then, the Department and contractor have partnered on methods to expedite culvert crossing installation, with the contractor offering 19 calendar days of time savings on their part. Finally, the additional work on the Wells Lake Road tie-in requires an additional 3 days of time, bringing the total time extension on the project to 935 calendar days.

During the course of the delay, the Department provided the contractor an opportunity to add paving work to the contract that was originally expected to be completed in a separate project (04X048). This was accomplished by change order and processed on March 18, 2022.

The project cost has increased by approximately \$5,350,000, primarily due to seven items: 1) inclusion of a reinforced concrete box culvert, 2) paving that was originally slated to be accomplished under another contract (04X048), 3) an additional 1/2 mile section of paving near the District HQ to tie in adjacent jobs/work, 4) design changes that lessen the impact to the Chad Colley and Wells Lake Road tie-ins, 5) upgrading signal cameras, 6) soil improvements, and 7) providing compensation to the contractor related to utility delays. More on this lattermost item will be discussed in further detail below.

In 2022, the contractor sent in a request to cancel the contract citing a nearly two-year delay related to utility conflicts. The contractor claimed that over the last approximately 2 years there have been dramatic increases in job costs due to inflation. These cost increases have impacted labor, equipment, materials, and hauling components of the work far exceeding the risk the contractor anticipated during their bid process. A change order to compensate the contractor for these costs was processed for \$2,933,612.17 in February 2023.





The project cost has increased approximately \$1,609,000 in total due to the following: 1) additional repair work required for bridges, i.e. approaches (grade adjustment, slab replacement, repairs), joints and deck (fix deterioration), and areas leading into bridges, i.e. median modifications, 2) strengthening edge of lane/shoulders, 3) additional striping for maintenance of traffic, 4) extra erosion control measures, 5) additional quantities of temporary barrier wall needed to safely construct the project according to plan, 6) additional miscellaneous maintenance of traffic costs, 7) replacement of deteriorated approach slabs, and 8) addition of Automated Work Zone Information System (AWIS) to promote notification and safe passage of the traveling public.

The contractor has finished work on 17 of 19 bridges. An earlier report showed 18 of 19, but the remaining structures (Arkansas River Crossing on Hwy 71B and its Relief Bridge) were inadvertently counted as one structure. Previously, work on these structures had been delayed due to not having right-of-entry access from the railroad (Union Pacific), which was later obtained on November 15, 2023. In the interim, the contractor decided to move their forces to complete a nearby project, 040898, which was declared substantially complete on May 14, 2024.

The contractor has recently remobilized to the site and is preparing to work on the expansion joints at the ends of the River and Relief bridges (05175 and 05176).


