

INTRODUCTION

In accordance with the Arkansas Highway Improvement Act of 2016, and specifically Arkansas Code § 27-65-107(a)(19), the Arkansas Highway Commission submits this report on the progress of each public road construction project of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) or more to the Highway Commission Review and Advisory Subcommittee of the Legislative Council.

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GLOSSARY

ACHM – Asphalt Concrete Hot Mix

Bridge and Approaches - Constructing bridge structures and sections leading up to the bridge

Calendar day contract – Contract where the number of calendar days are bid

CAP – Connecting Arkansas Program

CPM -- Critical Path Method—A step-by-step project management technique that identifies critical activities that must be completed before the next stage can proceed.

(F) - Project with Federal Oversight

Grading and Structures - Earthwork and bridge construction; "structures" includes bridges and drainage structures

Interchange – Improvements to the junction between two or more roadways, typically including an overpass or bridge with associated ramps

IRP – Interstate Rehabilitation Program

Major Widening – Widening of an existing roadway to improve capacity or enhance safety, generally by adding a lane or lanes

New Location – Construction of a roadway on a location not previously developed for vehicular transportation

PCC Pavement – Portland Cement Concrete Pavement

Reconstruction – Generally, removing an existing roadway and building a new road in the same place

Rehabilitation – Modifying or improving an existing roadway; generally less costly and less time consuming than a full reconstruction

Resurfacing – Installation or application of a new driving surface; could be an overlay, sealing job, or similar procedure

ROW – Right of Way

(S) – Project with State Oversight

Safety and Traffic Engineering – Various improvements to enhance safety and/or improve traffic flow

Working Day Contract – Contract for which time will be assessed for each day on which conditions allow the Contractor to work per Standard Specification for Highway Construction



The overall project cost has increased by approximately \$11.1 million due to additional quantity of High Density Polyurethane Foam (HDPF) to level the slabs, additional concrete patching required to repair slabs, misaligned dowel bars in the existing pavement, and a change to the type of joint rehabilitation to be applied to the roadway.

212 calendar days were added to the project to accomplish this additional work.



The contract amount has increased approximately \$961,000 due to the addition of Guardrail, additional Aggregate Base Course, Precast Concrete Barrier Wall (Pier Protection), and additional Asphalt Concrete Hot Mix Surface Course.

Change orders on the project have resulted in a credit of 10 calendar days for changes to the allowable lane closure times contained in the contract and a time extension of 5 days due to limitations on work during the eclipse.

The project became substantially complete on July 17, 2025. Punch-list items remain.





Recent work on the project has been to: place deck concrete and parapet walls, construct median barrier walls, various drainage structures, mechanically stabilized earth walls, perform undercut and embankment operations, and to place Asphalt Concrete Hot-Mix.

Change orders for additional work amounting to approximately \$274,000 have been processed for: additional removal and disposal work, drainage improvements, maintenance of traffic, and subgrade improvements.

Elimination of a planned jack-and-bore pipe has yielded a savings of approximately \$195,000. The net overrun on the job is approximately \$79,000.

The recent work on the project has been installation of Wire Rope Safety Fence (WRSF) posts and cables, as well as repairing damaged sections of WRSF and guardrail throughout the project.

Contract cost has increased by approximately \$1,970,000 due to: inadvertent omission of quantities for removal of a portion of the pavement structure, the added removal of the existing concrete ditch paving, additional drainage work, additional unclassified excavation, the addition of additional traffic control devices, spall repair work, and slope repair work. 





Construction began on February 20, 2023. The James Street Bridge and Southbound US 67/167 (I-57) Vandenberg Overpass Bridge are complete and open to traffic. With the completion of the southbound US 67/167 Vandenberg Overpass Bridge, the Southbound US 67/167 (I-57) traffic switch (onto the newly constructed PCCP pavement) was completed ahead of schedule and switched first week of April 2025. 





The contract amount has been reduced by approximately \$538,000 due to a plan error that doubled the quantities of reinforcing steel and concrete for approach gutters and slabs. This reduction has been offset by the addition of stone backfill due to unsuitable subgrade and the addition of drainage structures to address existing deteriorated pipe culverts. The net project reduction is now approximately \$271,000.

In the beginning, utility conflicts were encountered affecting the entire project. At this point utility relocations have been completed. Upon resolution of the majority of the conflicts, the Department and contractor agreed to an additional 951 calendar days to be awarded on June 19, 2023. Since then, the Department and contractor have partnered on methods to expedite culvert crossing installation, with the contractor offering 19 calendar days of time savings on their part. Additional work on the Wells Lake Road tie-in requires 3 more days of time. Lastly, 298 days were added for delays associated with relocation of a water line, bringing the total time extension on the project to 1,233 calendar days

During the course of the delay, the Department provided the contractor an opportunity to add paving work to the contract that was originally expected to be completed in a separate project (04X048). This was accomplished by change order and processed on March 18, 2022.

The project cost has increased by approximately \$5,380,000, primarily due to seven items: 1) inclusion and modifications to a reinforced concrete box culvert, 2) paving that was originally slated to be accomplished under another contract (04X048), 3) an additional 1/2 mile section of paving near the District HQ to tie in adjacent jobs/work, 4) design changes that lessen the impact to the Chad Colley and Wells Lake Road tie-ins, 5) upgrading signal cameras, 6) soil and drainage improvements, and 7) providing compensation to the contractor related to utility delays. More on this lattermost item will be discussed in further detail below.

In 2022, the contractor sent in a request to cancel the contract citing a nearly two-year delay related to utility conflicts. The contractor claimed that over the last approximately two years there have been dramatic increases in job costs due to inflation. These cost increases have impacted labor, equipment, materials, and hauling components of the work far exceeding the risk the contractor anticipated during their bid process. A change order to compensate the contractor for these costs was

For the last few months, the contractor continues to replace the backwalls (in stages) on the River and Relief Bridges (05175 and 05176). 

Each of the 154 Wrong Way Detection Systems (WWDS) in the contract are in various stages of construction. Approximately 100 systems are complete or nearly complete, with testing and integration of various systems being performed on a near weekly basis. Over 50 have been tested and remain under the contractors' control. No systems have been fully accepted by the Department.





The project is split into 4 zones. Work began on the new alignment bypass portion on January 2023. Earthwork operations have begun in Zone 1. Road base construction is ongoing in Zone 2A. In Zone 2B, earthwork operations are ongoing and construction of berms and retention ponds are nearing completion. Earthwork and existing structure demolition and drainage structure construction is ongoing in Zone 3.

The project amount has increased approximately \$2,494,000 to facilitate drainage structure modifications, provide slope stabilization around a previously undiscovered spring, additional erosion control activities, and removal of waste material.






