#### INTRODUCTION -

Three surveys of Arkansas educators (one each for superintendents, principals and teachers) provide one category of evidence for the Arkansas Senate and House Education Committees' biennial educational adequacy study. These data are considered in conjunction with school- and district-level data provided by local education associations and the Arkansas Department of Education; related data from other states and the nation; and secondary research into educational topics and best practices.

In December, the Bureau of Legislative Research (BLR) sent an emailed questionnaire asking the state's public school classroom teachers to select one of three dates during the spring semester that would be most convenient for them to complete the survey. As a result, on January 27, the adequacy surveys were distributed to 32,702 Arkansas public school classroom teachers, media specialists and school counselors who had email addresses recorded in the Arkansas Department of Education's computer network system. To encourage responses, the BLR sent a flier to principals explaining that the survey was arriving and its purpose, accompanied by a request that the fliers be posted where teachers would see them. The fliers were also sent with the surveys to the teachers with the request that they share them with fellow teachers.

According to the BLR's survey software, the teachers survey successfully reached the email inbox of 32,702 teachers and were viewed by 12,156 of them. Teachers were asked to complete the survey and submit it to BLR by February 7, 2025. After that date, the BLR kept the survey open for another 2.5 weeks and sent four subsequent emails to both teachers and their administrators reminding them about the survey. The final survey was accepted on February 24, 2025, bringing the total number of responses to 4,830.

The response rate for the teachers survey was 15%. The margin of error is less than +1% at a 95 percent confidence level. The 4,830 respondent teachers represented 254 of the state's 258 school districts and public charter school systems in 2025.












11. Do you receive at least 200 minutes of planning time per week to schedule conferences and plan instruction?




12. Is your planning time provided in increments of at least 40 minutes during the instructional day?




13. Is the planning time you receive during the instructional day sufficient?


















26. If no, under what conditions, if any, would you be willing to relocate to teach at a school in a high poverty or rural community?\*





29. Which statement best describes how long you plan to keep teaching?






32. Do you believe that teachers in your school are **evaluated fairly**?




33. Do you believe that teachers in your school are evaluated consistently?






