INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2015-009

3 REQUESTING THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL DIRECT THE SENATE
4 COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF POSSIBLE STATE
5 REGULATION OF INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES IN LIEU OF REGULATION BY
6 THE ARKANSAS ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION.

8 WHEREAS, the Arkansas Activities Association (hereafter "AAA") is a nonpublic entity that
9 regulates interscholastic activities within the State of Arkansas; and
10

11 WHEREAS, while the AAA receives a great deal of state funding through payments from public
12 schools, it is not subject to state regulation; and
13

14 WHEREAS, recent decisions by the AAA call into question its ability to regulate interscholastic
15 activities in a fair and well-reasoned manner that includes thoroughly investigating alleged violations of
16 AAA rules, consistently adhering to the provisions of its constitution and bylaws, and respecting the
17 accomplishments and achievements of student-athletes; and

19 WHEREAS, given the importance of interscholastic activities to student-athletes and Arkansas
20 communities and the amount of state dollars paid to the AAA to regulate athletics, a study should be
21 undertaken to determine if state regulation of interscholastic activities would result in cost savings for
22 public school districts and more efficient and effective regulation of interscholastic activities,

24 NOW THEREFORE,

25 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE NINETIETH GENERAL
26 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

28 THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council direct the Senate Committee on Education to conduct a
29 study of the possibility of state regulation of interscholastic activities in lieu of regulation by the AAA,
30 including without limitation the possibility of charging the Department of Education with regulating
31 interscholastic activities.

33 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT the Senate Committee on Education study additional
34 alternatives for regulation of interscholastic activities.
35

36 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council request the participation in

1 the study of the AAA, the Department of Education, and other persons the Senate Committee on
2 Education deems necessary to study the issue.

3

4 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT school administrators, coaches, and parents are invited to
5 attend meetings of the Senate Committee on Education at which the study occurs and share their
6 thoughts and opinions on the regulation of interscholastic activities at an appropriate time.
