Discussion of ISP 2025-052 by Representative Carol Dalby – An act to amend the Domestic Abuse Act of 1991; to provide for remote testimony in certain instances in a hearing under the Domestic Abuse Act of 1991; to amend requirements regarding service of pleadings or filings under an order of protection matter; to provide oversight for a domestic violence intervention program; and for other purposes [Exhibit D]

Beth Sanders, Executive Director, Arkansas Coalition against Domestic Violence (ACADV), and Barbara Mariani, Legal Counsel, ACADV, provided an overview of the Domestic Violence intervention programs their coalition provides. Hon. "Butch" Hale, Judge, 31st Judicial District; Hon. Amy Dunn Moore, Judge, Sixth Judicial Circuit; and Laura Calhoun, Staff Attorney, Administrative Office of the Courts; provided an overview of how ISP 2025-052 would affect the courts.
