13	regulate the practice of athletic training; and
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15	WHEREAS, athletic training education has made significant changes since
16	the establishment of the Arkansas Athletic Trainers Act, § 17-93-401 et seq.
17	in 1995; and
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19	WHEREAS, the scope of practice of athletic trainers covers several
20	diverse domains, including without limitation issues related to:
21	(1) Risk reduction, wellness, and health literacy;
22	(2) Assessment, evaluation, and diagnosis;
23	(3) Critical incident management;
24	(4) Therapeutic intervention; and
25	(5) Healthcare administration and professional responsibility;

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28	WHEREAS, athletic trainers should practice to the fullest extent of
29	their licensure, accreditation, certification, and education for the health
30	and safety of the public; and
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32	WHEREAS, other individual states and the federal government employ
33	athletic trainers in a variety of settings to treat a variety of patients;
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36	WHEREAS, research demonstrates that access to an athletic trainer saves

1	lives, improves quality of life, decreases missed workdays, and decreases
2	healthcare associated costs; and
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4	WHEREAS, to increase patient access to health care, reduce healthcare
5	costs, and promote efficient and timely health care in this state, the
6	General Assembly should modernize the scope of practice laws for athletic
7	trainers to reflect the Role Delineation Study/Practice Analysis and the most

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11	WHEREAS, there is an immediate need for athletic trainers in the state
12	of Arkansas, but it is difficult to recruit to those positions because other
13	states allow a more favorable scope of practice,

23	(1) Populations that athletic trainers treat;
24	(2) Settings where athletic trainers work and practice;
25	(3) How athletic trainers are supervised;
26	(4) Modification of temporary licensure for athletic trainers;

28	(5) Fees and penalties imposed on athletic trainers.
