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32	12-1-201. Title.
33	This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "James McFerron
34	Mental Health, Wellness, and Resiliency Act".
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36	12-1-202. Legislative findings and intent.

1	(a) The General Assembly linds that:
2	(1) Mental health conditions affect a significant portion of
3	first responders across the state and have long-term impacts on first
4	responders, their families, and the communities they serve;
5	(2) Increased training for peer-to-peer support and access to
6	mental health, leadership, wellness, and resiliency programs and services
7	lead to better mental and physical wellness in our first responders across
8	the state;
9	(3) Mental health, leadership, wellness, and resiliency training
10	and education programs improve a first responder's ability to cope with
11	stress, both on and off duty, trauma, and adversity; and
12	(4) A coordinated effort is needed to address first responder
13	mental health, leadership, wellness, and resiliency disparities amongst
14	state, county, and local agencies and to promote mental health, leadership,
15	wellness, and resiliency.
16	(b) The General Assembly intends this act to provide for mental
17	health, leadership, wellness, and resiliency training programs, services, and
18	resources to be accessible to all first responders across the state,
19	promoting holistic wellness.
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21	12-1-203. Definitions.
22	As used in this subchapter:
23	(1) "Certified peer support member" means a first responder, a
24	retired first responder, or a chaplain who has received training in providing
25	peer-to-peer support and been certified by the Department of Public Safety to
26	<pre>provide peer-to-peer support to other first responders;</pre>
27	(2) "Chaplain" means a member of the clergy;
28	(3) "First responder" means a person with specialized training
29	who is among the first to arrive and provide assistance or incident
30	resolution at the scene of an emergency, including without limitation a
31	certified law enforcement officer, a firefighter, an emergency medical
32	services provider, a public safety or emergency medical dispatcher, and an
33	employee of a correctional facility; and
34	(4) "Peer-to-peer support" includes without limitation
35	trainings, programs, resources, and emotional and moral support in subjects
36	including without limitation mental health, leadership, wellness, resiliency,

1	and critical incident stress management.
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3	12-1-204. Expansion of mental health services.
4	The Department of Public Safety shall develop and provide to first
5	responders in every region of the state:
6	(1) Training to become a certified peer support member; and
7	(2) Programs and resources on subjects including without
8	limitation mental health, leadership, wellness, resiliency, and critical
9	incident stress management.
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11	12-1-205. Peer-to-peer support network.
12	(a) The Department of Public Safety shall:
13	(1) Establish a peer-to-peer support network consisting of
14	volunteers who are certified peer support members;
15	(2) Designate an employee of the department to serve as the
16	coordinator for the peer-to-peer support network; and
17	(3) Work to ensure that members of the peer-to-peer support
18	network are located throughout the state.
19	(b) The department shall coordinate with the members of the peer-to-
20	peer network to:
21	(1) Provide peer-to-peer support to a requesting agency that
22	employs a first responder; and
23	(2) Ensure that peer-to-peer support is accessible to a first
24	responder in the state, regardless of location.
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26	12-1-206. Reporting.
27	The Department of Public Safety shall provide an annual report to the
28	Governor and Legislative Council summarizing the department's activities
29	under this subchapter.
