




### **CDBG Program Overview**

#### Where Does the Money Come From?

Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) are funded through the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The state CDBG program has been administered by AEDC since 1983.





### **CDBG Program**

Since 1983, more than \$900 million has been awarded to over 2,400 projects that have benefited Arkansans state-wide.

Benefit to low and moderate income (LMI) persons.

Eliminate conditions of slum and blight.


















### Arkansas Site Development Program

## **RURAL COMMUNITY GRANT**

Communities may request up to \$15,000 per grant cycle

50/50 match

DRS has \$700,000 to distribute each year

Two cycles per fiscal year in August and March, funds are distributed in October and May, respectively



# **RURAL COMMUNITY GRANT**
