




Collective Impact Occurs in a Community when an alliance comes together and provides economic and concrete family supports and relationships.


Sebastian County was the first county to prove the concept using the 100 Families Model.


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Fastest Growth in **Prison Population**








Highest % of Children with an **Incarcerated Parent**

According to a study done in 2015-16, 16 percent of children in Arkansas had at some point in their lives a parent or guardian locked up in prison or jail. That was the highest percentage of any state. Some nearby states also had similar percentages. The report by the Annie E. Casey Foundation followed a similar study done in 2011-12.



Reunification rate 43% w/o community coordination


Although families served had on average three areas of crisis in what is considered child welfare safety factors, the vast majority were moved to stability without EVER having child welfare involvement.


