SENATE BILL 544

"AN ACT TO SPECIFY THAT SIX (6) OF THE MEMBERS OF THE
ARKANSAS INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION REPRESENT
VARIOUS AGRICULTURAL INTERESTS; TO ALLOW FOR PER DIEM
EXPENSES OF COMMISSIONERS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Section 4 of Act 404 of 1955, as amended, the same being
Arkansas Statutes Annotated 9-507, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 4. The members so appointed by the Governor shall be selected
with special reference to their knowledge and interest in the resources and
industrial development of the State of Arkansas. As vacancies occur, the
Governor shall insure that six (6) members represent the various agricultural
interests in the State. Each member of the Commission shall be paid fifty
dollars (\$50.00) for each day spent attending official meetings of the entire
Commission and shall be reimbursed for actual expenditures for meals, lodging
and mileage at the same rates prescribed by law or regulations for state
employees."

SECTION 2. All laws, or parts of laws, in conflict with this Act are
hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined by the Seventy-Sixth
General Assembly that the immediate passage of this Act will help to insure
that agricultural interests are properly represented on the Arkansas
Industrial Development Commission. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared
to exist, and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and
after its passage and approval.
