SENATE BILL

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO TRANSFER THE DIVISION OF ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE
9 PREVENTION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; AND FOR OTHER
10 PURPOSES."

Subtitle

13 "TO TRANSFER THE DIVISION OF ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE
14 PREVENTION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH."

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

18 SECTION 1. The Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention
19 established within the Department of Human Services by Arkansas Code 20-64-601
20 is hereby transferred to the Department of Health by a type 2 transfer as
21 defined in Arkansas Code 25-2-105.

23 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
24 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
25 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

27 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
28 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
29 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
30 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
31 act are declared to be severable.

33 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
34 hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
2 Assembly that the Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention could best be
3 administered through the Department of Health; that the Division is now
4 located within the Department of Human Services; that this act transfers the
5 Division to the Department of Health; that the transfer should take effect at
6 the beginning of the next fiscal year; and that unless this emergency clause
7 is adopted this act will not take effect at the beginning of the next fiscal
8 year. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this act being
9 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
10 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1993.
