Such documentation shall provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall include the following: 20 21 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such 22 expenditures on the fund balance. 23 2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut 24 or any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance. 25 3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs 26 or one-time purchase of capitalized items. 27 4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not 28 jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent 29 depletion of the fund balance. 30 The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and (B) 31 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought 32 prior review by the Legislative Council. 33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 34 through June 30, 2005. 35 SECTION 41. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 36

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1 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 2 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and 3 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 4 5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 6 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 7 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 8 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 42. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 10 11 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 12 13 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 14 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 15 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 16 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 17 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 43. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 19 20 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 21 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of 22 23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 24 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the 25 26 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 27 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 28 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 29 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003. 30 31 */s/ Joint Budget Committee* 32 33 34
