21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22

23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for
24 the Ozarka College for the 2003-2005 biennium, the following maximum number
25 of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of
26 the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et
27 seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however,
28 that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein
29 in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform
30 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions
31 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular
32 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its
33 successor.

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31 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for the
 32 Ozarka College for the 2003-2005 biennium, the following maximum number of
 33 part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from
 34 funds appropriated herein for such purposes: sixty (60) temporary or part-
 35 time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in
 36 the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this

1 act for the appropriate classification.

3 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,
 4 to the Ozarka College, to be payable from the Ozarka College Fund, for
 5 personal services and operating expenses of the Ozarka College for the
 6 biennial period ending June 30, 2005, the following:

24 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to
 25 the Ozarka College, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code
 26 19-4-801 of the Ozarka College, for personal services and operating expenses
 27 of the Ozarka College for the biennial period ending June 30, 2005, the

12 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

14 PRIORITIES. A high priority of the Ozarka ~~Technical~~ College shall be to
15 combat illiteracy and to provide industrial training in the work place.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from ~~July 1, 2001~~
17 July 1, 2003 through ~~June 30, 2003~~ June 30, 2005.

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19 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND

21 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
22 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
23 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
24 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
25 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
26 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
27 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.

28 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the
29 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon
30 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal
31 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board
32 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
34 through June 30, 2005.

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36 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized

1 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
2 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
3 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
6 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
7 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
8 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
9 with in disbursement of said funds.

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11 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
12 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
13 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
14 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
15 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
16 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
17 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
18 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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20 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
21 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
22 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
23 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of
24 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
25 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
26 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
27 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
28 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
29 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
30 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
