FUNDS. Any Federal Mineral Leasing Funds, Federal Forest Reserve Funds,

Federal Flood Control Funds, or any similar turnback funds in the State

- 6 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

- 8 FUND BALANCE. Notwithstanding any law pertaining to the transfer of year-end
- 9 fund balances or any law to the contrary, any funds which remain in the
- 10 Department of Education Fund Account at the end of a fiscal year shall remain
- 11 in the Department of Education Fund Account and made available to fund
- 12 appropriation authorized by law and made payable from the Department of
- 13 Education Fund Account for the following fiscal year.

- 17 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
- 19 TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of this act the Chief Fiscal
- 20 Officer of the State shall transfer on his books, and those of the State
- 21 Treasurer and Auditor of State, the balance of monies remaining in the
- 22 Educational Loan Fund to the Education Revolving Loan Certificates Fund.
- 23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
- 24 through June 30, 2005.

- 26 SECTION 22. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
- 27 SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES PUBLIC
- 28 ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL INSURANCE FUND. (A) For all appropriations
- 29 as provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall monitor the
- 30 level of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly basis. If
- 31 any proposed expenditures would cause the Public Elementary and Secondary
- 32 School Insurance Fund to decline below two million eight hundred fifty two
- 33 thousand eight hundred thirty two dollars (\$2,852,832) a fund balance to
- 34 decline to less than fifty percent (50%) of the balance available on July 1,
- 35 2001, the disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive head of

- 14 (B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
- 15 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought
- 16 prior review by the Legislative Council.

- 20 SECTION 23. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
- 21 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds

- 23 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
- 24 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

- 30 SECTION 24. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
- 31 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
- 32 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
- 33 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
- 34 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
- 35 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
- 36 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or

1	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
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3	SECTION 25. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
4	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
5	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
6	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of
7	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
8	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
9	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
10	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
11	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
12	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
13	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
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
