Upon determination by the Board of Corrections that a reallocation of resources within the Department of Community 3 4 Correction and Department of Correction is necessary for the efficient and 5 effective operation of the departments, the Board, with approval of the 6 Governor and approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget 7 Committee, shall have the authority to instruct the department directors, to 8 request from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, a transfer of positions, 9 programs, funds, appropriations, and line-item appropriations within or between existing and newly created divisions, offices, sections, or units of 10 11 the departments. If it is determined that the requested transfer should be 12 made, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall then initiate the necessary 13 transfer documents to reflect the transfers upon the fiscal records of the State Treasurer, the State Auditor, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, 14 15 and the Departments of Correction and Community Correction. Provided, 16 however, that the Board shall be limited to submitting no more than 17 Four requests during any fiscal year. Transfer authority for unforeseen purposes shall further be limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the 18 19 total appropriation, funding, and positions specific to each agency. 20 However, there shall be no transfers to or from the County Jail Reimbursement 21 Fund. This is usually accomplished by 36 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and

1 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 2 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 3 has determined that the Department of Correction and the Department of 4 Community Correction may operate more efficiently if some flexibility is 5 provided to the Board of Corrections authorizing broad powers under the 6 Reallocation of Resources provisions herein. Therefore, it is both necessary 7 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring 8 prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as 9 provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. 10 11 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 12 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void. 13

22 SECTION 42. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 23 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 24 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of 25 26 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 27 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the 28 29 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 30 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 31 32 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003. 33 /s/ Joint Budget Committee 34 35
