SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the State Forestry Commission for the 2003-2005 biennium, the following maximum number of parttime or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: ninety (90) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

- SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION ADMINISTRATION PROGRAM. There is hereby appropriated, to be payable from the funds and fund accounts as set out herein, to the State Forestry Commission for the biennial period ending June 30, 2005, the following:
- 24 (a) For the Administration Program, the sum of \$2,783,350 for the 2003-2004 25 fiscal year and \$2,783,350 for the 2004-2005 fiscal year.
- 26 (1) Program Description. AFC administration, which includes personnel, 27 fiscal, and conservation education, will lead, direct, and support employees 28 to accomplish the agency mission.

the $\frac{\text{State}}{\text{Arkansas}}$ Forestry Commission determines that temporary

- 1 firefighters, dispatchers, or pilots are required to meet the demands of a
- 2 wildfire season, and upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State,
- 3 appropriations may be transferred from either Extra Help or Professional Fees
- 4 and Services to the proper character code for the employment of such
- 5 personnel.
- 6 If the State Arkansas Forestry Commission determines that the most effective
- 7 way for it to cooperate in the growing and distribution of forest planting
- 8 stock is by contracting work with private vendors and/or hiring temporary
- 9 employees for seasonal work, the Commission is hereby authorized, upon
- 10 approval by the Chief Fiscal Officer, to transfer the necessary appropriation
- 11 authorized by Item (02) and Item (05) of Section 3.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001

- 15 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
- 17 HELP PROVISION. No employee of the Arkansas Forestry Commission who is
- 18 employed as "Extra Help" may receive an amount to exceed 3/4 of the maximum
- 19 annual salary for a comparable position as authorized by Arkansas Code 21-5-
- 20 201 et seq. during any fiscal year, nor may such employee be employed for a
- 21 period of time to exceed nine (9) months in any single fiscal year.
- 22 Provided, however, that no employee of the Arkansas Forestry Commission who
- 23 is employed as "Extra Help" may receive an amount to exceed seventy five
- 24 percent (75%) of the maximum annual salary for a comparable position as
- 25 authorized by Arkansas Code 21-5-201 et seq. during any fiscal year, nor
- 26 shall such employee be employed for a period of time to exceed fourteen
- 27 fifteen hundred (1400) (1500) hours in any single fiscal year.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from $\frac{\text{July 1, 2001}}{\text{July 1, 2001}}$
- 29 July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005.

- 31 SECTION 7. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
- 32 SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES STATE
- 33 FORESTRY TRUST FUND. (A) For all appropriations as provided in this Act,
- 34 the agency disbursing officer shall monitor the level of fund balances in
- 35 relation to expenditures on a monthly basis. If any proposed expenditures
- 36 would cause the State Forestry Trust Fund to decline below five hundred

- 1 thirty-one thousand twenty two dollars (\$531,022) a fund balance to decline
- 2 to less than fifty percent (50%) of the balance available on July 1, 2001,
- 3 the disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive head of the
- 4 agency. Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the
- 5 agency head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of
- 6 the State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall
- 7 provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall
- 8 include the following:
- 9 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such
- 10 expenditures on the fund balance.
- 11 2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut
- 12 or any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance.
- 13 3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
- or one-time purchase of capitalized items.
- 15 4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not
- 16 jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
- 17 depletion of the fund balance.
- 18 (B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
- 19 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought
- 20 prior review by the Legislative Council.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
- 22 through June 30, 2005.

- 24 SECTION 8. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
- 25 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
- 26 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
- 27 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
- 28 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
- 29 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
- 30 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
- 31 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
- 32 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

- 34 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
- 35 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
- 36 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act

1	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
2	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
3	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
4	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
5	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
6	
7	SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
8	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
9	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
10	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of
11	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
12	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
13	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
14	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
15	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
16	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
17	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
