1 are hereby authorized to designate an appropriate Host Committee consisting 2 of members of the Arkansas General Assembly to conduct advanced planning and to conduct a program of activities for attendees of the 2004 Annual Meeting 3 4 of the Southern Legislative Conference of the Council of State Governments to 5 be held in Arkansas. Upon authorization of the President Pro Tempore and the 6 Speaker of the House, the Legislative Auditor shall have a voucher prepared 7 and cause a warrant to be issued in the amount as appropriated in this Act 8 for expenses of planning and hosting the Southern Legislative Conference. 9 The Legislative Auditor shall deposit or invest the funds in an account or 10 accounts in a qualified financial institution or institutions located in the 11 State of Arkansas established solely for planning and hosting the Southern Legislative Conference. The Host Committee shall have oversight 12 13 responsibilities over the funds. The Legislative Auditor shall be custodian of these funds, which shall be considered state governmental trust funds. 14 These funds are exempt from the provisions of the General Accounting and 15 16 Budgetary Procedures Law. Any funds remaining in the account after all 17 expenses for hosting the Southern Legislative Conference have been paid, not exceeding the amount appropriated for hosting the Southern Legislative 18 19 Conference, shall be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the 20 State Central Services Fund. 21 22 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 24 CONTINGENT POSITIONS. The Division of Legislative Audit is authorized to establish five (5) contingent positions for use in the event that unforeseen 25 26 conditions arise that increase the audit responsibility of the Division 27 beyond available resources that necessitates the hiring of staff in addition 28 to those positions authorized in Section 1 of this Act. No classification, 29 grade or salary level will be assigned to the contingent positions until such 30 time as specific needs are determined. The Legislative Joint Auditing 31 Committee shall authorize all requests to use the contingent positions. Authorized requests to use the contingent positions shall be filed with the 32 33 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State for review by the Legislative Council or

1 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER PROVISION - LINE ITEMS. The Legislative Auditor is hereby authorized to 3 4 direct the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to transfer appropriation 5 between the line items of the appropriation in Section 2 of this Act in such 6 amounts determined necessary in either fiscal year of the 2003 - 2005 7 biennium. In no event, however, shall the Regular Salaries line item in 8 Section 2 be increased or decreased by such transfers authorized herein, 9 until the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee reviews such 10 transfers. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 11 1, 2003 through June 30, 2005. 12 13 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY 14 15 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of the appropriation and funding authorized 16 for the audit of the State of Arkansas' Comprehensive Annual Financial Report 17 (CAFR) in Section 3 of this Act which remains at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004 shall be carried forward and made available for the same 18 purpose for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005. The provisions of this 19 section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2005. 20 21 22 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 23 24 SUPPLEMENT CAFR APPROPRIATION. Because the audit of the State's financial statements is essential to provide adequate information to the General 25 26 Assembly to determine the needs and legislative requirements of the state, to 27 provide adequate information to the Governor for proper management of the 28 affairs of the State, and to issue bonds from time to time, the payment of 29 the cost for securing the services of an independent auditor to audit the 30 State of Arkansas' Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR AUDIT) appropriation authorized in Section 3 herein may be supplemented through the 31 32 transfer of any other appropriations and funds available to the Division of 33 Legislative Audit in the event that the appropriation or funding provided for 34 the audit of the CAFR is inadequate. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2005. 35

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1	SECTION 12. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
2	by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
3	made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
4	restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
5	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
6	Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
7	control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
8	the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
9	strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.
10	
11	SECTION 13. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
12	that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
13	in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
14	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
15	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
16	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
17	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
18	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
19	
20	SECTION 14. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
21	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
22	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
23	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of
24	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
25	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
26	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
27	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
28	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
29	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
30	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
