The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be 8 9 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas 10 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract 11 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family 12 13 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and 14 15 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically 16 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not 17 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and 18 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas 19 20 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-21 Department of Pediatrics shall make semi-annual reports to the Arkansas 22 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services 23 offered through CHFLI. 24 25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect from July 1, 2003 through 26 June 30, 2005. 27 SECTION 29. - 33 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
- 34 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
- 35 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
- 36 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December

- 1 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
- 2 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during

- 36 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in

1	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
2	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
3	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
4	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
5	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
6	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
