These positions are 33 to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event 34 that the personal services needs of the University during the 2001-2003 2003-35 2005 biennium exceed the number of positions in a classification allocated to 36 the University by the Legislature. The University shall provide justification

1 to OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No
2 classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific
3 positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and approved

5 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is 6 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by 7 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly 8 9 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution. 10 11 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the 12 13 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the 14 15 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 16 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of 17 approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled 18 19 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 20 void.

The 26 Director of the Department of Health shall be the disbursing officer for the 27 Breast Cancer Control Fund and the Chancellor of the University of Arkansas 28 for Medical Sciences shall be the disbursing officer for the Breast Cancer 29 Research Fund.

30 (b) The moneys in the Breast Cancer Research Fund are to be allocated to 31 the Breast Cancer Research Program for the awarding of grants, chairs and 32 contracts to researchers for research with respect to the cause, cure, 33 treatment, prevention, and earlier detection of breast cancer and for 34 developing leadership in research in Arkansas.

35 (c) The moneys in the Breast Cancer Control Fund for the control of36 breast cancer are to be allocated according to the recommendations of the

1 Breast Cancer Control Advisory Board who shall establish the scope of 2 services of the program and programmatic priorities based on the analysis of available information. The advisory board shall also be responsible for 3 4 developing eligibility criterion to be applied in evaluating requests for 5 breast cancer control financial assistance from screened women who are found 6 to be in need of diagnostic and treatment services. The advisory board shall 7 also review contractual agreements for breast cancer control with providers 8 who will be rendering services through the program.

The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged 18 19 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief 20 21 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December 22 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or 23 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during 24 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due. 25 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the 26 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon 27 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal 28 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year. 29 30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2005. 31

33 SECTION 37. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 34 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 35 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 36 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and

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Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied

 SECTION 38. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly

9 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 10 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 11 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 12 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 13 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 14 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 15 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

17 SECTION 39. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 18 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 19 20 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of 21 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 22 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 23 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 24 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 25 26 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003. 27 28 29 */s/ Joint Budget Committee* 30 31 32 33 34
