27	WHEREAS, from t	he envy of the other teachers about the award, Ms.		
28	Woodridge realized th	e need for an annual teachers' day "for all teachers	s to	
29	be honored"; and

31	WHEREAS, from 1	944 to 1953, Ms. Woodridge wrote to the nation's		
32	governors, political leaders, and education leaders to gather support for a			
33	National Teachers' Da	y; and

35	WHEREAS, Ms. Wo	odridge credits Eleanor Roosevelt, with whom she had	1	
36	corresponded, as being the prime mover in persuading the Eighty-First			



1	Congress to pass a Joint Resolution in 1953 designating the first Tuesday in		
2	March as National Teachers' Day; and		
3			
4	WHEREAS, in 1980, Ms. Woodridge witnessed the signing into law, by then		
5	Governor Bill Clinton, the first Tuesday in March as Arkansas Teachers' Day;		
6	and		
7			
8	WHEREAS, this day continued to be observed until 1985 when the National		
9	Education Association and the National PTA established Teacher Appreciation		
10	Week as the first full week in May, and later voted to make the Tuesday of		
11	that week National Teacher Day; and		
12			
13	WHEREAS, in 1985, Ms. Woodridge was honored at the National Education		
14	Association's Human and Civil Rights Banquet in Washington, D.C., with a		
15	special award for her "tireless efforts to promote a positive image of the		
16	teaching profession through national, state, and local teacher's day		
17	celebration",

19	NOW THEREFORE,
