16 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. YOUTH 17 SERVICES - COMMUNITY-BASED RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS - RESTRICTIONS. 18 The Department of Human Services shall not contract or pay for community-based 19 20 residential programs within any municipality to house unrelated persons who 21 have been adjudicated delinquent of an act that would constitute a Class A 22 felony or higher or of a sexual offense or convicted of a Class A felony or 23 higher or sexual offense until the following conditions have been met: 24 1. Residents within one thousand (1,000) feet of the proposed location of the 25 facility shall be notified by mail;

26 2. A public hearing shall be conducted in the community of the proposed 27 location of the facility by the contract provider at least ten (10) days in 28 advance of the contract's effective date. Notice of the hearing shall be 29 made by mail to each of the residents within 1,000 feet of the proposed 30 location of the facility. The notification requirement shall not apply to 31 already existing facilities at already existing locations.

32 Provided further, upon establishment of such facilities within a 33 particular municipality, the contract provider and the Department shall 34 establish and implement a system to receive and respond to complaints and 35 questions from residents of such municipality. In the event the Department 36 and the provider fail to provide satisfactory communication as provided in

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1 this section to the residents, such facility may be declared a public 2 nuisance by the municipality.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001
4 July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005.

6 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 8 OF FUNDS FOR THE JUVENILE OMBUDSMAN PROGRAM. The Department of Human 9 Services shall provide funding in an amount not to exceed \$300,000 \$230,000 10 for each fiscal year of the biennial period ending June 30, 2003 June 30, 11 2005 for the Juvenile Ombudsman Program described in ACA 16-87-216. Upon 12 request by the Executive Director of the Arkansas Public Defender Commission, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer an amount not to exceed 13 14 \$300,000 \$230,000 for each year of the biennial period ending June 30, 2003 15 June 30, 2005 from an account designated by the Director of the Department of 16 Human Services to the State Central Services Fund as a direct revenue to fund 17 the Juvenile Ombudsman Program.

19 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 20 21 OF FUNDS FOR LOCAL JUVENILE DETENTION FACILITIES. The Chief Fiscal Officer 22 of the State shall transfer funds in an amount of \$400,000 for each fiscal 23 year of the biennial period ending June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005 from the 24 Department of Human Services - Youth Services Fund Account to the Juvenile 25 Detention Facilities Operating Fund to fund the appropriation to the 26 Department of Finance and Administration - Disbursing Officer for grants for 27 operating expenses of local juvenile detention facilities.

28

The amount of the funds transferred in each fiscal year of the biennial period ended June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005 may be adjusted upon request of the Director of the Department of Human Services on a pro-rata basis with any reductions provided in the Revenue Stabilization Law from the July 1 Official Forecast of general revenue funding for the Division of Youth Services.

35 SECTION 9. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 36 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds

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1 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 2 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 3 4 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 5 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 6 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 7 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 8 9 SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 10 11 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 12 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 13 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by

14 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 15 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 16 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

18 SECTION 11. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 19 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 20 21 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of 22 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 23 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the 24 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 25 26 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 27 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 28 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003. 29 /s/ Joint Budget Committee 30 31 32 33 34
