NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 3 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 4 "(10)(A) Department of Human Services Grants Fund Account. The Department 5 of Human Services Grants Fund Account shall be used for the following grant 6 programs to consist of general revenues and any other nonfederal funds, as 7 may be appropriated by the General Assembly: 8 (i) Children's Medical Services; 9 (ii) Food Stamp Employment and Training Program; 10 (iii) Aid to the Aged, Blind, and Disabled; 11 (iv) Transitional Employment Assistance Program; 12 (v) Private nursing home care; (vi) Infant Infirmary - nursing home care; 13 14 (vii) Public Nursing Home Care; 15 (viii) Prescription Drugs; 16 (ix) Hospital and Medical Services; 17 (x) Child and Family Life Institute; 18 (xi) Community Services Block Grant; 19 (xii) ARKIDSFIRST; (xiii) Child Health Management Services; 20 21 (xiv) Child Care Grant; and 22 (xv) Prescription Drug Elderly" 23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001 July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005. 24 25 26 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MEDICAL 28 SERVICES AND COUNTY OPERATIONS -- CARRY FORWARD. - 15 Financing Administration Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

- 23 (2) identification that a provider or group of providers has consistently
- 24 charged rates to the Arkansas Medicaid Program greater than to other
- 25 purchasers of medical services of similar size, (3) the Division determines
- 26 that there has been significant changes in the technology or process by which
- 27 services are provided by a provider or group of providers which has affected
- 28 the costs of providing services, or (4) a severe economic downturn in the
- 29 Arkansas economy which has affected the overall state budget of the Division
- 30 of Medical Services.
- 31 The Division of Medical Services shall make available to requesting
- 32 providers, the Health Care Financing Administration's CMS's inflationary
- 33 forecasts (HCFA-CMS Market Basket Index). Rates established with cost of
- 34 living increases based on the HCFA-CMS Market Basket Index or other indices
- 35 will be adjusted annually except when the state budget does not provide
- 36 sufficient appropriation and funding to affect the change or portion thereof.

1 (b) Any rate methodology changes proposed by the Division of Medical Services 2 both of a general and specific nature, shall be subject to prior review by 3 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001 5 July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005. 6 7 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MEDICAL 9 SERVICES - STATE MEDICAID PROGRAM/PERSONAL CARE PROGRAM. It is the 10 Legislative intent that the Department of Human Services in its 11 administration of the Arkansas Medicaid Program set forth Medicaid provider 12 participation requirements for "personal care providers" that will insure sufficient available providers to meet the required needs of all eligible 13 14 recipients, to include insuring available in-home services twenty-four hours 15 a day and seven days a week for personal care. For the purposes of this 16 section, "private care agencies" are defined as those providers licensed by 17 the Department of Labor as of January 1, 1999, certified as ElderChoices Providers as of January 1, 1999 and who furnish in-home staffing services for 18 19 respite, chore services, and homemaker services, and carrying liability insurance of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) covering their 20 21 employees and independent contractors while they are engaged in providing 22 services, such as personal care, respite, chore services, and homemaker 23 services. The purpose of this section is to allow the private care agencies defined herein to be eligible to provide Medicaid reimbursed personal care 24 25 services on Saturdays and Sundays only, and does not supercede Department of 26 Human Services rules establishing monthly benefit limits and prior 27 authorization requirements. The availability of providers shall not require 28 the Department of Human Services to reimburse for 24 hours per day of 29 personal care services. The Arkansas Department of Human Services, Medical 30 Services Division shall take such action as required by the Health Care Financing Administration Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to amend 31 32 the Arkansas Medicaid manual to include, private care agencies defined 33 herein, as qualified entities to provide Medicaid reimbursed personal care 34 services. The private care agencies defined herein shall comply with rules 35 and regulations promulgated by the Arkansas Department of Health which shall 36 establish a separate licensure category for the private care agencies defined

- l herein for the provision of Medicaid reimbursable personal care services on
- 2 weekends. The Arkansas Department of Health shall supervise the conduct of
- 3 the private care agencies defined herein. The purpose of this section is to
- 4 insure the care provided by the private care agencies defined herein, is
- 5 consistent with the rules and regulations of the Arkansas Department of

The Arkansas Children's Hospital may request the 4 Department of Human Services - Division of Medical Services to retain in the 5 Department of Human Services Grant Fund account an amount not to exceed 6 \$2,100,000 each fiscal year from funds made available by this Act for the 7 Child and Family Life Institute, Section-5 4, item number 06 to be used to 8 match federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas 9 Children's Hospital. These retained funds shall not be recovered for transfer 10 to the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund. 11 12 SECTION 19. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 13 14 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 15 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and 16 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 17 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 18 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 19 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 20 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 21 SECTION 20. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 22 23 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 24 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 25 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 26 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 27 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 28 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 29 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 30 31 SECTION 21. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 32 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 33 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 34 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of 35 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 36

1	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
2	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
3	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
4	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
5	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
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
