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1 Providers as of January 1, 1999 and who furnish in-home staffing services for 2 respite, chore services, and homemaker services, and carrying liability insurance of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) covering their 3 4 employees and independent contractors while they are engaged in providing 5 services, such as personal care, respite, chore services, and homemaker 6 services. The purpose of this section is to allow the private care agencies 7 defined herein to be eligible to provide Medicaid reimbursed personal care 8 services on Saturdays and Sundays only, and does not supercede Department of 9 Human Services rules establishing monthly benefit limits and prior authorization requirements. The availability of providers shall not require 10 11 the Department of Human Services to reimburse for 24 hours per day of 12 personal care services. The Arkansas Department of Human Services, Medical Services Division shall take such action as required by the Health Care 13 Financing Administration Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to amend 14 15 the Arkansas Medicaid manual to include, private care agencies defined 16 herein, as qualified entities to provide Medicaid reimbursed personal care 17 services. The Arkansas Children's Hospital may request the 23 Department of Human Services - Division of Medical Services to retain in the 24 Department of Human Services Grant Fund account an amount not to exceed 25 \$2,100,000 each fiscal year from funds made available by this Act for the 26 Child and Family Life Institute, Section-5 4, item number 06 to be used to 27 match federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas 28 Children's Hospital. These retained funds shall not be recovered for transfer 29 to the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund. 30 31 SECTION 21. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 32 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 33 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 34 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and 35 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 36 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal

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1 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 2 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 3 4 5 SECTION 22. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 6 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 7 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 8 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 9 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 10 11 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 12 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 13 14 SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 15 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 16 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 17 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 18 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 19 20 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the 21 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 22 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 23 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003, except 24 for Section 9 which shall be in full force and effect from and after the date 25 26 of passage and approval of this Act. 27 28 */s/ Joint Budget Committee* 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36
