7 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PUBLIC 9 PARTICIPATION. Arkansas Department of Economic Development (ADED) shall make 10 additional efforts to increase non-traditional public participation in its 11 annual update to the Five Year Consolidated Plan and the new Five Year 12 Consolidated Plan. These efforts shall be in addition to current public 13 notification methods. Notification should be considered through direct mail 14 out to mayors and county judges, contacts with planning and development 15 districts, contact with the Department of Rural Services, submissions to 16 grant notification publications, and publication on ADED's web page. ADED is 17 encouraged to develop additional innovative public awareness strategies. 18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001 July 19 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005.

21 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. RURAL 23 DEVELOPMENT. From the funds appropriated for COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANTS 24 within the Community Development Program in this Act for Community Assistance-Federal, the Arkansas <u>Department of</u> Economic Development (ADED) 25 26 Commission (AEDC) shall allocate \$500,000 per fiscal year to the Rural 27 Development Set-Aside from the Economic Development Set-Aside, as defined in 28 ADED's AEDC's Consolidated Plan filed with the federal Department of Housing 29 and Urban Development. Funds allocated to the Rural Development Set-Aside 30 are to be used exclusively for grants to rural communities as defined in the 31 Consolidated Plan. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001 July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005. 32 33

SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 34 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING 36 COORDINATION. The Arkansas Department of Economic Development will designate

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an existing position to serve as a coordinator for the dissemination of
 information concerning water and wastewater funding programs available from
 state and federal agencies participating in the Water/Wastewater Advisory
 Committee. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July

7 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANT 9 REVIEW. The Arkansas Department of Economic Development (ADED) Commission 10 (AEDC) shall review all applications for grant funds from the Rural 11 Development Set-Aside and shall certify to the Department of Rural Services 12 those applications eligible for grant funds under ADED AEDC and federal guidelines. The Department of Rural Services alone shall decide which grant 13 14 applications will be funded, and ADED AEDC shall disburse grant funds from 15 the Rural Development Set-Aside to those applicants receiving final approval 16 by the Department of Rural Services. ADED AEDC and the Department of Rural 17 Services shall promulgate rules and regulations governing the application for and disbursement of grant funds from the Rural Development Set-Aside, and an 18 19 annual report of the disposition of these grant funds shall be made to the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee. The provisions of this section shall be 20 21 in effect only from July 1, 2001 July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 22 2005.

SECTION 20. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 24 25 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 26 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 27 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and 28 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 29 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 30 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 31 32 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

34 SECTION 21. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 35 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 36 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act

2	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by

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7	SECTION 22. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
8	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
9	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
10	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of
11	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
12	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
13	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
14	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
15	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
16	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
17	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
